ADMISSIONS

The college follows all the admission guidelines laid down by the University of Delhi. This year the College admitted 1431 students. The total number of students on its rolls is 4011.

COURSES OFFERED

We offer a wide array of courses at Mata Sundri College. Keeping in mind the changing needs of the students we were able to introduce two new courses. Two very popular courses **Statistics (Hons.) and Computer Science (Hons.)** have been introduced.

Other honours and programme courses are offered in Commerce, English, Hindi, Sanskrit, Punjabi, History, Psychology, Philosophy, Mathematics, Political Science, Education, Economics and Urdu. A four year B. El. Ed. Course is also offered. Postgraduate courses are offered in Punjabi, Hindi, Sanskrit and Political Science.

With a view to improving the job prospects of the students, vocational courses like Computer Application, Textile Designing, Travel and Tour Management and Foreign Languages. Students attend these classes after their regular lecture periods.

BEST STUDENT OF THE YEAR

The college focusses on all-round development of each student. Each year an award is given to the student who best embodies this vision. Names of students are invited for this award. Students are expected to meet the criteria laid down by the screening committee. The Principal and Student Council advisors carry out the screening process which is very comprehensive and rigorous. AN OVERVIEW OF THE YEAR

The academic session began on 20th July 2017. Along with the regular functioning of the college many events were organised which made college life an enriching experience.

STUDENT COUNCIL ELECTION

The first event of the year was the Council Election. For most students this is their first voting experience of their lives. This makes it an exciting and much awaited event. This year the Student Council election was held on 12th September 2017 at Mata Gujri Hall. Approximately 1100 students cast their votes. Adequate measures were taken to ensure that the elections were held in free, fair and transparent manner. Members of the staff were involved in closely monitoring the entire election process. The Student Council Office bearers carry out many important roles and help in increasing student participation in every college activity.

STUDENT COUNCIL DAY AND FRESHERS' PARTY

The Freshers' Party is the most exciting event for our first semester students. To facilitate the new Student Union and their oath taking ceremony, a formal function was organised on 9th October 2017. Parindey- the college dramatics society performed a play which highlighted the struggle of the Indian Independence Legend Shaheed Bhagat Singh, at Mata Sahib Kaur Auditorium.

The Student Council Day was attended by the S. Manjit Singh GK, President, Delhi Sikh Gurudwara Committee as the Chief Guest, S. Manjinder Singh Sirsa, General Secretary Delhi Sikh Gurudwara Committee, as the Guest of Honor, and Pt. Dalchand Sharma, Professor in Department of Music, Delhi University was the Distinguished Guest.

On the same day, 'Angels on Halloween', a theme based party was arranged to welcome the freshers. A Miss Fresher contest was organised which showcased the talents of the freshers as they introduced themselves to the seniors.

BANI, DECLAMATION AND KIRTAN COMPETITION

The annual Bani, Declamation and Kirtan Competition is organised to encourage a comprehensive knowledge of the important aspects of Sikh religion and provide a platform to students of all ages to imbibe value education from the lives of the Sikh Gurus. This year the Bani, Declamation and Kirtan competition was held on 1st and 2nd November, 2017.

Students from public, khalsa, and government schools and colleges participated in this event. On the first day, Bani and Declamation competition for school and college levels were held. In Bani 312 individuals participated. 159 teams participated in the Kirtan competition. In Declamation competition 145 teams and 269 individuals participated. Every year the performance of Nursery Level students is a delight to watch. Their ability to sing kirtans in perfect harmony at such a young age is commendable. The Governing Body Members S. Harinderpal Singh and S. R.P. Singh were the distinguished Guest and presented the prizes to the winners.

ANNUAL GENERAL KNOWLEDGE TEST

The first round of the Annual General Knowledge Quiz Competition of Mata Sundri College for Women was conducted on 18th January 2018. It was a written quiz competition. 73 students participated and 31 students qualified for the second round. The second round was held on 1st February 2018 at Mata Sahib Kaur Auditorium. There were 11 teams with three members each who had qualified for the second round of the competition. The Quiz was divided into four sections. Section I was Questions with Option. The questions were on History, Heritage and Mythology. Section II was a Visual section with two rounds of questions on Environment and Technology. Section III was an Audio section with one round of questions on the same topics. Section IV was the Rapid Fire section in which questions of General Knowledge were asked. Each team was given 40 sections to answer as many questions as they could in the stipulated time. After each section an Audience Round was conducted.

Team I -Priyanka Gupta, Shikha Khokar and Vaishnavi of IIIrd year History Honours won the first prize. Team E - Shruti Srivastava, Priyanka Mishra of Political Science Honours and Jasmine Kaur of Philosophy Honours stood second. Team G - Ruchi Bharadwaj, Vareni Awasthi and Medha Anand of Philosophy honours stood third.

LOKRANG INTER STATE UNIVERSITY FOLK SONG COMPETITION

Lokrang, an inter- state university folk song competition was a new event organised as a part of the continuing Golden Jubilee celebrations. Held during the Annual College Festival, the competition was organised on 7th February 2018. Many universities like **Agra University, Punjab University, GCW Faridabad, Punjabi University Patiala, GNDU, Jammu University, Manav Rachna University, Delhi University, I. P. University** participated in this competition. Zazim Sharma, a renowned Bollywood singer and music director was the special invitee. He along with Dr. Vineet Goswami, Assistant professor, Department of Music and Fine Arts, Delhi University were also judges for the event. The participants enthralled the audience with beautiful renditions of folk songs.

Randeep Kaur from Punjab University bagged the first prize and was awarded a trophy and cash prize. Gurkawal Kaur from Punjabi University and Gaganjit Kaur from GNDU were awarded the second prize. Karuna from Jammu University and Kajal from Mata Sundri College, University of Delhi stood third.

SAARANG

The annual cultural festival was held from 7th to 9th February. The festival began with the inaugural ceremony in the presence of the College Governing Body members and the Principal. This was followed by **Guru Nanak Paper Reading Competition** in which many teams participated. The topic of the competition was 'Relevance of Guru Nanak's Teachings in the Contemporary World'. The Divinity Society of the College presented a **skit** titled "**Kiv Kudde Tute Paal**" – How can the veil of illusion be torn away? It was based on the two younger sahibzaades of Guru Gobind Singh ji gaining martyrdom at the mere age of 5 and 7 years. The play was directed by the team of "Tram- Impact Arts" Gurjant Singh, S. Harpreet Singh and Mrs. Upasana Batra Sahota. The play showed the significance of the sacrifice of two younger sahibzaades of Guru Gobind Singh Ji – Baba Zorawar Singh Ji and Baba Fateh Singh Ji which was beautifully enacted by the students. The play was highly appreciated by the audience.

On 7th February, **Debate** on the topic "Should Cell Phone be used during Class", **Kavita**- a competition on self-composed poems, **Ghazal**, **Rang Barse**- Mehendi and Rangoli, **Classical**, **Folk** and **Group Song**, **Sanskrit Shlokavritti**, **Sanskrit Prashanmanch**, **Funk out of Junk**, **Folk Dance**, **Ad O Mania** and **Hunar-e-Kagaz** - a Paper Art Competitions were held.

On 8th February **Hoonkar**- the Nukkad Natak competition, **Antakashri**, **Brain Teaser**- Quiz competition, **Thirak**- Solo Classical Dance and Western Dance Competitions were held. The Live Performance of "The White Walkers Band" in Antakshari was appreciated by everyone. Two new events were introduced this year. **IT Web Page Design Competition** (Offline) on the theme "Repurposing: The Ultimate in Creativity and Recycling" and **Eco-Evolution** on the theme "Conceptual Model Competition For Contering Environment" were held.

On 9th February, renowned Punjabi Singer Noddy Singh and DJ Tatva K mesmerized the audience with their performance. In all 13 academic and 10 cultural events were held. There were 150 teams in which 900 participants participated in 23 events. 45 colleges took part in the festival. Apart from Delhi University colleges, other universities of Delhi and NCR such as **Jamia Millia Islamia**, **Amity University**, **IGNOU**, **I.P. University**, **Lal Bhadur Shastri Sanskrit Vidyapeeth** also took part in the festival. The three day festival was successfully organised with the active involvement of students and staff.

GOLDEN JUBILEE CELEBRATION

The college completed 50 years in 2017. This milestone was celebrated by a gathering of important personalities from various walks of life at Siri Fort Auditorium on 27th February, 2018. The Chairman of the College S.Vikramjit Singh Sahney Padma Shri, on behalf of the Governing Body Members, Principal and Staff played the host for the evening.

This journey of 50 years was documented in a **film** on **Mata Sundri ji** which was shown at the

event. This film highlighted the achievements of this institution, while tracing the history of the College to Mata Sundri Ji. A **Souvenir** detailing the lifespan of the college with inputs from various significant travellers of this college was also released on the occasion by the **Chief Guest Shri Mukhtar Abaas Naqvi , Union Minister for Minority Affairs**. The celebrations at Siri Fort Auditorium began with the college prayer which was followed by a heartwarming, energizing Gidha and Bhangra performances by the cultural society teams of Mata Sundri College. The honorable Chief Guest for the function Shri Mukhtar Abaas Naqvi, who witnessed the same, was lavish in his praise for the show put up by students. He also lauded the role of institutions like Mata Sundri College in forwarding the course of women's education in post independent India. S. Vikramjit Singh Sahney Padma Shri, in his welcome address shared with the gathering, the eclectic range of courses offered at Mata Sundri College. The college, apart from academic courses also hosts skill development programs. These are conducted by Sun Foundation lead by S. Vikramjit Singh Sahney Padma Shri under the government's National Skill Development initiative. The guests of honor of the day, **Dr. Baltej Singh Mann, Member National Council for Minority Educational Institutions** in India reiterated the views expressed by the honorable chief guest. He detailed upon the work being done by NCMEI to strengthen its mandate.

A detailed look into the eventful life of this institution was given by the Guest of Honour, Sardar Manjit Singh G.K., President Delhi Sikh Gurudwara Management Committee. Many, who are a part of the institution, but were unaware of the struggles faced in establishing the college were appreciative of the grit and vision of the founder members of the college. The College in order to commemorate its Golden Jubilee organized a **National Essay Competition** to document the life of Mata Sundri Ji. Four winners were awarded cash prizes by the honorable guests. Meritorious students who achieved top positions in the examinations held by Delhi University in different courses also received awards.

To make the celebrations of these 50 years truly meaningful, faculty & staff who joined the institution on its opening day were honored by the Chief Guest & Guest of Honour. The governing body of the college, to immortalize this event gifted a tablet to all members of the faculty & staff of the college. For the students too, a gift marking this momentous event, was announced. The high point of the evening was a **Musical Extravaganza** by the popular Sufi singer **Ms. Harshdeep Kaur**. She connected with the audience with her engaging performance. The function came to close with a vote of thanks by the Principal.

MATA SUNDRI SMRITI DIWAS

The Founder's Day, Mata Sundri Smriti Diwas was observed with reverence on 12th March. To commemorate this day the 'Sri Akhand Path Sahib' was held on 10th March and the 'Samapti' of Sri Akhand Path Sahib took place on 12th March. This was followed by recitation of Gurbani Kirtan by the Ragi Jatha of Bhai Kuttar Singhji as well as by the divinity society students. Bhai Khattar Singh after reciting the Bani subsequently explained its meaning to the Sangat. S. Harinderpal Singh – honorable member of college Governing Body and Chairman

of Gurmat College addressed the students. S. R. P. Singh- Chairman, Building Committee of College and S. Prithipal Singh- honorable member of college Governing Body graced the occasion. This was followed by Guru ka Langar for all the students, teachers and staff members. The college was well-lit on all three days to celebrate Founder's Day.

To promote knowledge on Mata Sundriji the Library along with Divinity Society of the College organized a book exhibition on the 12 and 13th March, 2018 on the theme “Mata Sundri Ji: A Gateway to Value Education”. It was an enriching experience for students and staff many of whom were not familiar with the vast literature on Mata Sundriji.

ANNUAL SPORTS DAY

Annual Sports Day is the prize distribution day for the students who have won competitions throughout the academic year. This year the 51st Annual Sports Day was organised on 9th March 2018. The Chief Guest of this event was Dr. Sandeep Tiwari, H.O.D., Department of Physical Education and Sports Science, University of Delhi. S. Harinder Pal Singh, S. DIVINITY SOCIETY

Every thursday the *diwan sahib* is held at 1:00p.m. at the college gurdwara sahib. The students perform *paath* followed by *Kirtan* for an hour. Kirtan and tabla classes are held by the trained students of society to the enthusiasts. The students and staff participated in the '**Nagar Kirtan**' which is organised by Delhi Sikh Gurudwara Management Committee, Delhi. Nagar kirtan took place on 3rd November on the occasion of Guru Nanak Dev Ji's Janam Dihaara (birthday), on 23rd November on the occasion of martyrdom of ninth Guru - Guru Teg Bahadur Sahib Ji and 24th December on the occasion of Prakash Utsav of Guru Gobind Singh Ji in which many students and staff participated.

The debating society regularly organised **intra-college debate, essay** and **MUN competitions**. Members of the society actively participated in many inter-college debate, poetry and essay competitions and won prizes. From 12-14th October the students participated in **Pacem IMUN** in Jodhpur, Kaavya Chhabra, Maths (Hons), 1st year and Neeraja Nair, Political Science (Hons) 1st year were awarded 'Special Mention' and 'Verbal Recognition' respectively. On 22nd January Shraddha Sharma Pol Sci.(Hons.) I Sem. participated in **Ekagra, an Essay Writing competition** organized by ABVP Central Zone, on the topic “The Philosophy of Swami Vivekananda” and won the 1st prize.

On 7th February, as part of the College Festival Saraang, the society organized a debate competition on the topic “The prohibition of cell phones in the classroom will facilitate a better educational environment”. There were around 40 participants in total from a wide range of institutions. Priya Rana (B.Com Prog. II year) won the III prize in the Individual category and Ridhi Gaba (B Com Prog II year) and Neeraja Nair (Pol Sci. Hons I year) of our college won the III prize in the Team category. WORLD UNIVERSITY SERVICES

The college WUS team participated in the General Body Meeting at Shahid Bhagat Singh College on 14 December 2017. The agenda of the meeting was to plan and participate in the decision making of the WUS university level activities for the year. A **week long employability workshop** of 25 hours was held between 5 March 2018 to 10 March 2018, during the mid-semester break, by WUS in association with B.A. Programme students and Sambhawana Foundation, Bangalore and Labour Net, Delhi . The workshop was offered to 53 students, of which 43 students were given certificates for successful completion of the programme. The course was based on a survey of the difficulties students face while entering work sites. They were also offered an experiential approach to learning the soft skills expected in work places. COMMITTEES AND CELLS

STUDENT COUNCIL

The Student Council organised many activities this year. The **Student Council Day** and **Freshers Party** was organised in September. A 3days/4nights **college trip** from 20th – 24th December 2017 to Jaisalmer was organised. 145 girls from various departments of the college went on the trip. Eleven students of our college from various disciplines attended the lecture by President Frank-Walter Steinmeier, Federal Republic of Germany at University of Delhi on Friday, 23rd March 2018. The topic was "India and Germany - Ideas and Perspectives", organised by Delhi University and the German Embassy.

A **General Assembly** was organised by IQAC, together with the Student Council for the students on Monday, 16th October 2017 at 12:30pm in the Mata Sahib Kaur Auditorium. The agendas were Interaction with Delhi Police regarding safety measures for women, Environment protection during Diwali and the upcoming end semester exams in November 2017.

PLACEMENT CELL

The Placement Cell is an active and vital part of the all-round development of every student of the College. Every year the team actively participates in the **career guidance fair** organized at Rakabganj Gurudwara. This academic year many reputed MNC's and companies have **recruited talented students** from our college. Concentrix recruited 30, PAN Atharva - 15, FIS (Result yet to be announced), Maruti Suzuki -15, Urban Clap -28 and RBS -30.

The team has organized numerous **workshops on C.V. Building & Interview Skills** by faculty from IILM, Personality Development, Opportunities abroad by Infinite Opportunities Abroad, Career counseling by T.I.M.E. Institute. The Placement Cell has brought in **internships** from 30 renowned and recognized companies, helping students learn necessary skills required to tackle problems that occur in the working of an individual entity.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL

The IQAC of the College submitted its first **Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR)** after the accreditation of the college. IQAC is focused on development of its constituents; hence it organized two major initiatives. The first of these was a talk given by **Prof. Emeritus Dr. S.S. Nathawat** (Head, Amity Centre for Positivism- Jaipur) on the topic “Role of Positive Emotions for enhancing work productivity”. On 30th October, 2017, Students, Faculty and Staff were offered practical guidelines for enhancing productivity using emotions. The second engagement was with **Dr. J.M.Patil, Adviser N.A.A.C.** who delivered a valuable talk on revised accreditation framework being adopted by N.A.A.C. The Enabling Unit was established in 2010-11 to provide accessible education with equal facilities for differently abled staff and students. Continuous efforts are made to make the college barrier free. To facilitate the learning process a new **braille embosser** and **accessible smart phones** for visually challenged students have been purchased.

WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CELL

On 20th March 2018, a talk on **Gender Equality & Women Empowerment** was organised. Dr. Radhika Menon and Dr Shehla Nawab were the speakers. The talk was on women's equal participation in all areas of life with a strong focus on increasing women's participation in leadership positions. Many students attended this programme. An inter-class Poster making competition on **Participation and Ending Violence against Women** was also held. W.D.C. is also planning to organize an exhibition on Women's Right to Equality in April, 2018.

INTERNAL COMPLAINT COMMITTEE

The members of the ICC attended a two days seminar organised by the All India Institute for Human Values and Resource Development on " Sexual harassment of women in workplace - Prevention , Prohibition, Redressal" on 25 -26 August , 2017 at AIACHE , Secretariat , New Delhi. In order to spread awareness regarding sexual harassment, a talk was organised on 20th September 2017 in the college premises with three honourable guest speakers Ms. Meera Kaura Patel (Advocate of high court), Ms. Pyoli Swatija (Advocate of Supreme Court), Mrs Santosh Khanna (Member of NGO and founder of Vidhi Bhartiya Parishad). The main objective of the talk was to sensitize students on gender issues and to inform them about sexual harassment and mechanisms to cope up with any such problem. The seminar was attended by more than 300 students who actively participated in the open house discussion and Act. 2013. To ensure that every student and staff of the college has access to information about ICC, several hoardings and posters were installed in various visible locations of the college. College students and staff were also informed about the redressal mechanism and functioning of ICC.

PRESS COMMITTEE

The team worked diligently to give maximum coverage to college functions. The various functions were covered by Navodaya Times, Navbharat Times, Dainik Jagaran, Punjab Kesari and Punjabi Tribune online.

ANTI-RAGGING CELL

The College follows the Ordinance XV-C of the University of Delhi on curbing the menace of ragging. The aim of the cell has been to prohibit any act of teasing a fresher or indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activity with freshers. We are alert that no fresher has to undergo

hardship or psychological harm due to this. During the orientation programme students were made aware that ragging is strictly prohibited and is a punishable offence. An Anti-Ragging Squad of Final Year students was formed and they took rounds in the college to ensure that no ragging took place. CCTV cameras are installed in vital points to ensure the same. Awareness is also spread through large bold and colourful charts, posters and leaflets. Round the clock helpline numbers of committee members is on display in these charts. Notices sent by the University about the menace of ragging are on display at all important places in the college.

No case of Ragging was reported in our college during this Academic Year.

GARDEN COMMITTEE

This year the college won 8 out of 12 categories at the 60th Delhi University Flower Show which was held on 23rd February 2018 -two first prizes, two second prizes, two third prizes and two high recommendations.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

The motto of N.S.S. is “Not me but you” an important principle in inculcating a sense of social and civic responsibility among students. On 21st June, **National Yoga Day** was celebrated in the college premises. College students, Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff participated in it. On 27th and 28th July a **Voter's Identity Card Camp** was organised. The SDM officer interacted with the students and informed them about the process of acquiring a Voter's Identity Card. **Swachhata Pakhwara** was celebrated from 2nd -10th August. During that period many activities like, Oath Taking Ceremony, Slum Visit, Cleanliness drive (inside & outside the Campus) were organized. The main purpose of **Rally for Rivers** was to protect our rivers. NSS volunteers attended workshops on Rally for Rivers held in Delhi on 29th August, 19th September and 22nd September. Our volunteers also participated in rallies conducted by the NSS Unit. On 1st September a **Cloth Donation Camp** was organized to help the slum dwellers. NATIONAL CADET CORPS

The National Cadet Corps wing of the college is a part of the Indian Military Cadet Corps

with its headquarters in New Delhi. The cadets are given basic military training in small arms, drills, first aid, nursing, map reading and civil defense.

65 Cadets completed **Combined Annual Training Camp** between 13th -22nd June. At the camp **Yoga Day** was celebrated on 21st June 2017. The cadets participated in many competitions and won prizes. They were given the title of Camp Senior, Mess Senior and Cultural Senior. A total of 9 cadets were selected to attend the first cadre (19th – 28th July). 3 cadets qualified for the 3rd cadre (4th -13th September) where they were further trained in map reading, field signals, obstacles, home nursing and firing. 3 cadets participated at **National Integration Camp , West Bengal and Sikkim**. The Senior Under Officer of the college NCC was appointed as the 2nd senior of the camp, the title of Best Cadet and Master of Ceremony were also given to our cadets.

70 cadets participated in the fortnight-long sanitation campaign of PM Narendra Modi '**Swachhta hi Seva**'. President Ram Nath Kovind launched the programme on 15th September from Ishworiganj village in Kanpur to highlight the Swach Bharat mission. A poster making competition was organised as a part of this campaign. This Indian delegation to Bangladesh has important military, cultural and social significance and is inarguably **the highest achievement possible for a cadet during his or her 3 years of NCC training**. NON COLLEGIATE WOMEN'S EDUCATION BOARD (NCWEB)

The Non-Collegiate Women Education Board organised various activities and programmes during the academic year 2017-2018. The **Orientation Day** began with Prayer, Paath and Kirtan in Gurudwara which was followed by distribution of prasad. The academic calendar was announced and a brief introduction about NCWEB & Mata Sundri College was given to freshers.

Along with regular lectures many programmes were also organised. **Institutional visit** and workshop at SEBI, Industrial visit to Cyber Hub - Indian Drugs and Pharmaceuticals Limited (IDPL), **Historical Study Tour** to Qutub Minar, and Humayun Tomb were organised. A **recruitment drive** was organised where many students were selected for internship. NCWEB published the **e-magazine Aparajita** which provides a platform for expression of thoughtful, creative and innovative ideas of teachers and students.

Attention was given to the academic performance of the students by conducting regular tests and assignments. Harinderpal Singh, Chairman Gurmat College and member of the college governing body. Students participated in functions and programmes at several regular colleges and at the university and won prizes.

DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

B.A PROGRAMME COMMITTEE

The B.A (Programme) students have an independent committee which provides a platform to the students to enhance their skills and hone their talents. Quiz and debate were organised for the students in September. Students actively participated in both events. An Orientation Programme and a talk by Dr. Divya Rajput were held on 16th October, 2017. An Alumni Meet was organized on 3rd February, 2018. It was a special gesture by the college towards former students to re-live their memories. From 5th to 10th March 2018 a workshop was conducted by Mr. Ranjan Anand where 55 students participated. It included skill enhancement, personality development, placement drive and interview.

DEPARTMENT OF ELEMENTARY EDUCATION

The Decennial Anniversary Celebration of the Department was marked by a series of **talks** by various scholars and academicians for instance Prof Harjeet Kaur Bhatia (Jamia Milia Islamia), Prof Vasanthi Raman (Centre for Women's Development Studies), Prof. Anita Ghai (Ambedkar University) to name a few. The Department released its souvenir report 'Decennial Lecture Series' which was uploaded on the college website.

The Department's School Collaboration Project **SAHYOG- Stepping Together Ahead** with Sri GuruHarkrishan Khalsa Girls Senior Secondary School and Kamlesh Balika Vidyalaya (both primary and middle schools) was continued and further strengthened this year. An alumni meet was also organised. A **souvenir** entitled '**Celebrating 10 years of B.El.Ed**' was released and distributed among the alumnae. A **Parent Teacher Interaction** for I, II and III year students was held in February.

The department organized a **special lecture** by Ms.Kamla Bhasin, an internationally acclaimed feminist, activist, poet, author and South Asia Coordinator of One Billion Rising, on the theme Gender and Education. It was indeed a matter of great honor and privilege to engage with her on the issue at hand. The **annual newsletter Aalekh**, was released. The department Placement Committee invited reputed schools such as Presidium, BNPS, ARK Foundation and established organisations such as LEADS for campus placement. Eighteen students are placed in Presidium, BNPS, ARK Foundation schools and eight students were selected by LEADS.

HINDI

During the meet the President, Vice President, Secretary and Joint Secretary of the alumni association were elected. Hindi was conducted. On 15th March a movie 'Panch Light' was screened for the students. ENGLISH

The Department of English began the year with an **Academic Meet** on 30th August, 2017. MATHEMATICS, COMPUTER SCIENCE AND STATISTICS

The Department of Mathematics, Statistics and Computer Science has a very dynamic Mathematical Society named "Asymptote". It conducted its first **National Conference** on "Advances in Applied Mathematics and Statistics" (NCAAMS2017) during September 07-08, 2017. The conference was sponsored by Science and Engineering Research Board (DST-SERB) and Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO). The Principal welcomed the esteemed guests: the Chief Guest- **Dr. (Mrs) Pankaj Mittal, Additional Secretary-I (UGC)**, the Guests of honour **Prof. Sudhir R. Ghorpade, IIT Mumbai** and Prof. B.K. Dass, University of Delhi, the other distinguished guests -**Dr. Preeti Ahuja, the Honourable Members of Governing Body**, and **Dr. Manmohan Kaur, Principal of GNDU Khalsa College (DU)**. The

two-day event was attended by over 150 research scholars and delegates from renowned institutions of India including Central/State universities such as University of Delhi, Jamia Millia Islamia University, South Asian University, Amity University (Noida), University of Allahabad, IIT's, NIT's and several others.

HISTORY

The Department organised a **one day seminar** on Kabir titled **Kabir: Symbol of Syncretic India** on March 16, 2018. ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

World Environment Day was celebrated with full enthusiasm by the teachers and students of Department of Environmental Science of Mata Sundri College for Women on 1st June 2017. Department of Environmental Science organized a competition entitled "Eco-Evolution" (Conceptual model competition for countering environmental issues) on 7th February 2018, for all undergraduate non science students of Delhi University. **Field excursions** were

organized where students were taken to Aravalli Biodiversity Park, Vasant Vihar, New Delhi and Yamuna Biodiversity Park, near Wazirabad, New Delhi where students are given special outdoor lectures by Principal Scientists and Nature education team officers. The department has a tie up with Ministry of Environment, Forest and climate change along with National Museum of Natural History for taking up many environmental awareness programs for our students all-round the year.

The Department is conducting a **research on environmental awareness and water pollution among undergraduate students**. Regarding the same, questionnaire has been formed and data collection is in process. The research seeks to analyze the level of awareness of the environment among the youth of Delhi NCR.

ECONOMICS

Economics students attended 'Neem Schools for Value Education, White Swan Consulting Group and WCG Foundation at IIT Delhi, New Delhi on 28 October. On 8th November students attended 'CII Delhi Higher Education Summit' at Silver Oak Hall, India Habitat Centre. Students also attended 'Chai Pe Banking with a Special Focus on Startups' at Hotel Leela Palace. On 31st January and "Demonetisation and GST: Emerging Issues in Indian Economy" organised by Department of Economics, Shaheed Bhagat Singh College (University of Delhi) at India International Centre on 2 February. Deevleena Dey presented a paper titled 'Tossing the Bitcoin: Implications for the Indian Economy' at the 'National Young Economists Conclave' 2018 organised by Department of Economics, Shaheed Bhagat Singh Evening College (University of Delhi) on 15th March.

VOCATIONAL CENTRE

COMPUTER APPLICATIONS

The college offers UGC Sponsored Certificate, Diploma and Advance Diploma Courses in Computer Applications. A large numbers of regular and non-collegiate students are getting benefited from this course. These courses prepare the students to develop Information Technology Skills to get a flavour of web designing and application software development. The final year project is a major element of the Advance Diploma in Computer Application course which provides an excellent platform for the students to design and develop applications as a team or as an individual at their own pace and time.

In this academic year 2017-18, 145 students enrolled for the certificate course. 60 students upgraded themselves for the Diploma course and 21 students upgraded themselves for the Advance Diploma of Computer Application course. Students were able to get placements in various companies. The Computer Application department along with the Computer

Science Department of the college organized an “IT Web Designing Competition” in which 3rd Year student participated enthusiastically.

TRAVEL AND TOURISM

Travel & Tourism department continues to excel in its endeavor in providing right technical training to its students. Our placement record this year speaks for itself. 13 out of a total student strength of 20 secured placements under reputed brands like EXL, Go-Ibibo, Bird Group, UNI Holidays, DEX group, Thinkhotel, RBS etc. with a good pay package.

2 students from our 3rd year batch appeared for **IATA International Certificate** foundation level exam and successfully cleared the exam, scoring brilliantly. The department got the opportunity for a Field visit to Hotel Leela Ambience Convention Hotel. This visit was organized on 03rd Nov 2017 for 1st year students. In October 2017, 3 students of our 3rd year batch were selected for a 10 day Internship Programme with SOTC. A 2-day “Tour Costing” workshop was conducted for our 3rd year students on 22nd-23rd Feb 2018. Mr Arun Bajaj from UNI holidays was invited to conduct the session for the graduating students. A three day Education trip (04th Mar-06th Mar 2018) with special focus on Team building activities was organised.

FOREIGN LANGUAGES

The College offers Certificate Course in German, French and Spanish Language. These Certificate Courses are part of the Vocational Centre of the college. Students are therefore offered these courses in order to enhance their job opportunities and also gain knowledge of a new languages and its culture. In the year 2017, 78 students enrolled in German Certificate Course, 80 in French Certificate Course and 55 Students enrolled for Spanish Certificate Course. The College has also started diploma course in these languages from this academic session. 20 Students enrolled in German Diploma, 9 students enrolled for Spanish Diploma and 2 Students in French Diploma Course were enrolled.

TEXTILE

The college offers UGC sponsored certificate, Diploma and Advanced diploma in Textile Designing. A large number of regular and non-collegiate students have enrolled in this course. These courses prepare the students to inculcate a close awareness of current trends, new development and technological changes in the field of textile. The final year provide the depth, scope and professional competence through formal and non-formal education program for continued professional growth. In this academic year 2017-18, 14 students enrolled for the certificate course, 10 students upgraded themselves for diploma course and 6 students upgraded themselves for the advanced diploma of Textile designing.

SUN FOUNDATION

Sun Foundation, an initiative of S. Vikramjit Singh Sahney Padma Shri, has set up a free skill development and vocational training centre under the project 'Surya Kiran' at Mata Sundri College. The aim of these programmes is to tap into the aesthetic sense of young students and to transform them into professionally skilled women. Each stream is equipped to train 584 students between 2015 to 2018. The training is being provided free of cost. New industrial machine, instruments, printing table and a reference library in a colourful and creative classroom has been made to enhance the students' understanding of fabric, surface, colour combinations and the knowledge of Indian textiles. This will enable them to work under designers as well as in export and import houses

61 students benefitted from these courses in the year 2017 - 2018. 54 students successfully completed the course in the year 2017-18. A fashion designing workshop, Sewing machine demo, Students Market survey, Teachers Day celebration, Women's Day celebration, Education fair during Saarang, and Certificate Distribution during college annual day celebration were the other highlights of the year.

INFRASTRUCTURE

The following infrastructure development works were carried out during the year 2017-18.

Development of New Computer Laboratory: The College has developed a new Computer Laboratory on fourth floor with a capacity of 40 PCs. All the cabling and networking is completed and the installation of PCs is likely to be completed by 30th April 2018. This is exclusively developed for students of B.Sc. (Hons.) in Computer Science and B.Sc (Hons) Statistics..

The Construction of a new Porta Cabin block consisting of 10 rooms on Fourth Floor of Block A of the College is in progress and will be completed by 31st May, 2018.

The work on a **new lift** with a capacity of 15 passengers for students is in progress. It is likely to be completed by 31st May, 2018.

The Fish Style Flower pots are placed on the windows of Computer Labs to stop sun heat coming from outside the labs. It is done on the recommendation of Expert from Centre for Science and Environment.

LIBRARY

The total number of books in the Library (including B.El.Ed. and Book Bank) as on 16.03.2018 is 1,07,909 (One lakh seven thousand nine hundred and nine). 1,617 (One thousand six hundred and seventeen) books were added during the year 2017-18. The Library also subscribes to 66 journals and magazines. The Library Department organized 7 Book
