Presently, he is the Chair Professor at Sri Guru Tegh Bahadur National Integration Chair, Punjab University. Besides this, he is also the Visiting Professor at the San Jose State University in California (USA) for Global and Diaspora Studies.

Dr. Mann is a widely travelled person. He visited Pakistan and Nepal as a member of the Indian South Asian Fraternity (SAF) delegation to strengthen people to people relationship. Dr. Mann was invited by the Concordia University Wisconsin (CUW) in 2000 and 2001, to deliver guest lectures on the theme of International Economics, Sikhism and Indo-Pak Relations. As a Deputy leader of Punjabi University educational delegation to the United States of America, Canada, Germany and United Kingdom in 2005 and 2006, Dr. Mann mobilised a donation of more than one million US dollars for the Golden Heart Scholarship Project which proved a milestone in reaching the marginalized in educationally backward rural areas of Punjab. He was also instrumental in promoting cooperative agreements with foreign Universities in USA, Canada and Germany.

On the academic side, his main interests are in National Integration, Monetary and Industrial Economics, Global and Diaspora studies. His published works include *Economic Development of Scheduled Castes*, *Working of Industrial Estates*, *National Integration and Communal Harmony* and *South Asian Spectrum*.

## ADMISSIONS

The College has 3840 students on its rolls. 1171 students were admitted in the academic year 2015-16.

## COURSES OFFERED

In the Humanities stream, the College offers Honours courses in **English, Hindi, Sanskrit, Punjabi, History, Psychology, Philosophy and Political Science**. Programme courses are offered in all the above mentioned subjects along with **Education, Economics, Mathematics and Urdu**. In Commerce, **B.Com (Prog)** and **B.Com (Hons.)** are offered. **B.Sc (Hons)** in **Mathematics** is also offered.

Our College is one of the eight colleges which offers the four year **B.El.Ed. Course**.

**Post Graduate** courses are offered in **Punjabi, Hindi, Sanskrit and Political Science**.

The College offers **Vocational Courses** in **Computer Application, Textile Designing, Travel and Tour Management and Foreign Languages**. 490 students were enrolled in the courses in the academic year 2015-16.

## AN OVERVIEW OF THE YEAR

### NAAC PEER TEAM VISIT

The **National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) Peer Team** visited College for authentication and validation of the Self Study Report (SSR) submitted to NAAC in May 2015. The visit lasted over a period of three days from March 28th to March 30th, 2016. The team was led by **Dr. Meena R. Chandawarkar, Vice Chancellor Karnataka State Women's University**. She was the Chairperson, while **Professor P Geetha, Department of English, M.G. University Kottayam, Kerala** was the member Coordinator. **Dr. Maitreyee Bardan Roy**, former Principal, Basanti Devi College, Kolkata was the member.

### **COMMITTEES AND CELLS**

#### **STUDENT COUNCIL**

The Student Council of the college represents its students and is a forum through which the students can voice their concerns. It is independent of the Delhi University Student Council and



each student of the college is a de facto member with voting rights. The Student Council organised many activities this academic year:

The Student Council of Mata Sundri College took the students out for a fun day of **Picnic** at World of Wonder (WOW), Noida. Around 250 students went for this picnic.

The Student Union office bearers along with other students also actively participate in social causes. They joined the campaign against releasing the accused in the 'Nirbhaya' case. The students signed a poster and gave it to Smt. Asha Devi, mother of the victim at Jantar Mantar, to lend their support to her cause.

A project '**My Soil My Tree Youth Unity**' was organised. In this project the students collected soil from all the Delhi University colleges as a sign of youth unity and planted a tree to symbolize unity. The Council organised a **college trip** to Jim Corbett National Park from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2016 to 5<sup>th</sup> April 2016.

## PLACEMENT CELL

The Placement Cell envisions students to become learned and good corporate citizens. The Cell aims to inculcate in them clarity of concept, confidence, discipline, boldness, motivation and a desire to excel in all spheres of life. With its motto to 'strive for perfection', the Placement Cell has been continuously grooming students in corporate etiquettes, resume creation, campus to corporate transition, communication skills, aptitude tests and interviews. Every year, the cell does its utmost to increase the list of recruiting companies so as to provide more opportunities for the students of the College. It is always aiming to push the envelope and go beyond its past performances - this means more and better companies and better and more valued placements for every student.

Following are the details of different **placement drives, seminars** and **career workshops** organised for the outgoing final year students :

## ENABLING UNIT

The Enabling Unit was established in 2010-11 with a view to focus on providing accessible education with equal facilities for the differently-abled. This academic year, the Unit acquired a **resource room** and a **soundproof recording room** with **recording facility**. Three **stair lifts** and one **stair climber** was installed. Visually challenged students have been given **smartphones** and **angel pro software** has been installed. **2D disabled friendly** signage have been put up in front of the classrooms, labs and administration rooms. With a view to improving accessibility, many **ramps** with **steel railings** have been constructed in the College. The college has a **Helen Keller Unit**. **Headphones, new computers** and **NVDA software** were also acquired this year.

## G.K.SOCIETY

'Quiz Up', the G.K. Society seeks to promote a quest for knowledge. This year the society organised the General Knowledge Test which is an annual event. It comprised of **two round of G.K. test** and **Quiz** respectively. Many students participated in the test and the winners were given prizes. Students belonging to this society also participated in various inter-college competitions.

## EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL

The Equal Opportunity Cell of Mata Sundri College is a fully functional body working in close coordination with the Enabling Unit. The EOC ensures that both students and employees from all sections of the society are given an equal opportunity to grow and prosper. Affirmative action has been taken in terms of providing a professionally and academically stimulating environment for the staff and students. The teaching learning environment is motivating and the intellectual environment is one in

## **NORTH EAST WELFARE CELL**

The two Nodal officers of the Cell are in constant touch with the students through telephone, Facebook and Whatsapp.

## **WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CELL**

On 9<sup>th</sup> March, 2016 the Women Development Cell organised a **seminar** on '**Health, Hygiene and Sexual Harassment**'. Four renowned speakers Dr. Sabna Nazir, Dr. Mridula Tandon, Ms. Priyanka Jain and Ms Katja Polc presided over the function and shared their views on the subject with the students. The seminar's main focus was on spreading awareness on women's health issues and health and cleanness in daily life. The seminar also focused on organizational practices for women's safety, prevention of sexual harassment at work places, regenerating values, and building trust between genders, to create and maintain an environment free from sexual harassment.

An **inter class essay writing competition** was organised on 'Women's Rights in the 21<sup>st</sup> century'. The main focus was on women's equal participation in all areas of life with a strong focus on increasing women's leadership and ending violence against women.

On the occasion of International Women's Day on 8<sup>th</sup> March, 2016 an **inter-class poster making competition** was organised in the college. Many students participated in the competition. On 9<sup>th</sup> March, 2016 students of the college also presented a **paper reading** on the topic 'Beti Bachao Beti Padhao'.

## **INTERNAL COMPLAINT COMMITTEE**

The Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) of Mata Sundri College for Women in collaboration with WDC organized a two day programme related to women's empowerment on the occasion of International Women's Day. On 9<sup>th</sup> March, 2016 a **Seminar** was organized to sensitize the students and employees with the provision of the Sexual Harassment Act. The speakers were Dr. (Mrs.) Mridula Tandon, (President Sakshi: Centre for Information, Education & Communication), Dr. Shabana Nazer (Educationist & Poet) and Uzma and Kulsom students of the college. Both the speakers Dr. Tandon and Dr. Wazir were of the opinion that a sense of security at the workplace will improve women's participation in work, resulting in their economic empowerment and inclusive growth in the fast changing economic scenario of the country.



The committee has placed guidelines of the Sexual Harassment Act, 2013 at prominent places in the College i.e. Student Notice Board, Administrative Wing, Corridors and the Canteen to ensure safety in & outside the college.

To ensure adequate publicity – posters, charts were also displayed and a few booklets with guidelines have been kept in the Library.

All the members of Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) attended a one day workshop organized by the University of Delhi, Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) in collaboration with Women Studies & Development Centre at ARC Building, University of Delhi on 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2015.

Under Section 21 and under the directives of the UGC vide D.O. letter no. F-91-1/2-13 (GS) dated 23.07.2015, Annual Report on cases of Sexual Harassment for the period of 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2014 to 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2015 with details of constitution of ICC was sent to UGC to furnish the information to the Government of India.

Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) also replied to the request made by Mr. Himanshu Sinha on 06.08.2015 under RTI Act, 2005.

**No Complaint has been registered under this Act till date.**

## **ANTI-RAGGING CELL**

The College diligently follows the **Ordinance XV-C OF the University of Delhi on curbing the menace of ragging**. Our objective is 'to prohibit any conduct by any student by act of teasing, treating or handling rudeness with a fresher or indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm. Every year an **orientation program** is conducted where students are made aware that ragging is strictly prohibited and it is punishable offence. **Anti-Ragging squads** of senior students are formed and they take rounds in college to ensure that no ragging takes place. Awareness is also spread through **posters** and **leaflets**. **Round the clock helpline numbers** of committee members are on display. In addition, **notices** sent by the University and flex board **signages** are displayed at important places in College.

**No case of ragging was reported in our college this academic year.**

## **PRESS COMMITTEE**

The Press committee worked tirelessly throughout the year ensuring maximum coverage of college functions. The various events in the college were covered by the print media.

## **GARDEN COMMITTEE**

The Garden Committee with the help of gardeners and students have put in a lot of hard work to grow green plants and flowers. A dozen fruits plants have been planted in big pots. The committee worked continuously to beautify the college as well as increase the green coverage.

The College participated in the 58th Annual Flower Show organized by Delhi University and won **many prizes**. Shri Mahender Pal was given the '**Best Mali**' Award.



## NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

The College has an active wing of the NSS which guides the students towards socially relevant activities. Various activities were organised by the NSS this year :

## **COMPUTER APPLICATION**

In this academic year 176 students enrolled of this course. The second year students of Web Designing developed many websites as a part of their project work. Third year students developed dynamic websites using Java as a front end & Oracle as a back end, as a part their Project work.

## **FOREIGN LANGUAGES**

The College provides a one year Certificate Course in French, German and Spanish in collaboration with the Department of Germanic and Romance Studies, University of Delhi. In this academic year 66 students enrolled in German, 56 students in French and 43 Students in Spanish.



## TRAVEL AND TOURISM

Travel and Tourism is a very popular vocational subject. Apart from lectures, presentations, group discussions and mock interviews are also a part of the pedagogical tools used to enhance the aptitude of the students. The students were taken to Ranthambore on an educational trip. Visits to the banks of the Chambal River was also organised during this trip.

The department has a very high placement record of 90% with well known brands.

## INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT

The college undertook the following infrastructure development works during the year 2015-16:

A **New Sports Complex** has been constructed with the facilities of a **green room, changing rooms** and **toilets**.

New modern equipment including **Treadmill code Pro7900, Cross Trainer 8809, Spine Bike M5809A, Standing Twister, 10 new judo mats, new badminton poles** etc have been added in the gymnasium. One **new computer laboratory** has been constructed.

A **new Enabling Unit** has been constructed with **sound proof recording room, Braille materials, laptops with angel pro software** and **projectors**.

Two new rooms have been refurbished and made into an **IQAC Room** and a **NAAC Room**. **New LED** tube lights have been fixed in Computer Labs, 3 Psychology Labs, B.El.Ed Lab, OMSP Lab, Principal's Office and Conference Room.

**New Reframing and Fixing of ACP Sheets of Auditorium** and plastering of lower part of Auditorium wall towards Gurdwara Mata Sundri Ji has been completed

**Three new Chair Lifts** have been installed in the entry gate to basement of Block A and on entry to Library

**New lecture stands** have been added to the class rooms.

**Ramps with steel railing** have been constructed for entry to Main Building gates, Canteen, Auditorium, tutorial Cabins in basement.

A **green belt** has been created on the exterior side of main boundary wall of our college with new plants and grass.

The College building has been provided with an **RO water treatment plant with 1000 litres capacity per hour**, one more RO plant has been installed exclusively for canteen use and **five new water coolers** have been installed.

**Two incinerators for burning used sanitary napkins** and one **vending machine for sanitary napkins** has been installed in the college.

The Medical room has been renovated with a **new surgical bed, weighing machine, BP apparatus** and **medical aids**.



All the MM Projectors labs, Administration room, Accounts room, Music room have been provided with **new curtains and blinds**.

The College auditorium sound system has been renovated.

The Principal's Office, Common Room, Administration & Accounts office, Placement Cell have been provided with **Aluminium glass windows**.

The total no. of books as on 31.03.2016 were 98996 (Ninety eight thousand nine hundred ninety six). 2022 (two thousand twenty two) books were added this academic year. The library also subscribes to 63 journals and magazines. In year 2015-16 a total of 13,225 books were weeded out from the library's records
