This Annual report is an attempt to acknowledge the above, lead by example and encourage students to achieve even greater heights.

Before we proceed to felicitate our achievements, we should take time to pay our homage to dear colleagues whom we lost untimely to the pandemic. Mrs Chetan Kaur - Department of Commerce (joined on 10 January 2005) and Dr. Amarjit Kaur – Department of Punjabi (joined on 31 July 2018) have left a lasting legacy both in the halls of the college and in our hearts. Their presence is sorely missed, especially today, but their memories continue to inspire us.

The Report present before you is a testimony to our struggle to maintain academic excellence despite the hardships we have all suffered. This year, virtual teaching continued for the majority of the year, however Delhi University allowed offline mode of teaching from mid-February and we welcomed back our students to the college premises. While the decision was a welcome move for both students and teachers, it brought its challenges such as maintaining necessary COVID-19 protocol. In this our staff – both teaching and non-teaching – came together to ensure that our students adapted well to the change. While college was already organizing several online events for students throughout the year, in the offline mode we organized many physical events to induct our students to their college life.

Several milestones were achieved during this academic year. A series of FDPs were organized for our teaching staff, and several short-term courses were offered to our students. A series of seminars/conferences were organized at both international and national level where eminent speakers addressed the audience. Various committees/cells like, Library Progression Committee, CASMA

Cell (CA/CS/CMA Guidance Cell), M.A. Motivation Cell, and Motivation to M.B.A. Cell were also formed to enrich the academic experience of students. Our students won a variety of awards in competitions on the local and national level, and added great value to the academic, cultural and ethical values of the college.

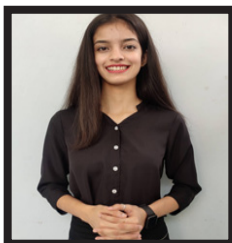
It's a tradition in our college to invite an eminent personality as the Chief Guest on Annual Day, to give away the prizes to our students. She shares her life's journey with us, so that all the other students and Staff too, can be inspired by the former's achievements and words of wisdom. Madam Harpreet A De. Singh has many firsts to her credit. After obtaining a licence for flying commercial planes from Indira Gandhi Rashtriya Uran Akademi (IGRUA) in 1988, she joined Air India as its first woman pilot. Her dreams of flying was cut short when she had to give it up due to health reasons. But she was undeterred by this temporary setback and trained to become an instructor. She was rehired by Air India as an instructor to train pilots. She then became the first female instructor in India. In 2015 she also became the first female Chief of Flight Safety and the first woman Head of Quality Management Systems of an airline. When she was took charge as the CEO of Alliance Air, this was again the first time that a woman was made CEO of airlines in India. Madam Singh has been a recipient of many awards like the prestigious "Bharat Ratna Dr APJ Abdul Kalam Excellence Award for Outstanding Personal Achievement and Distinguished Services to the Nation" in 2020, and the "IATA Inspirational Role Model Award" in 2021, a first for India. She is also the President of the Indian Women Pilot Association. We hope that Madam Singh's achievements will motivate our students to pursue their dreams. Her life is a testament to the fact that for a woman with self-belief, hard work, and dedication, any goal is attainable. The presence of Madam Harpreet A De Singh at the Annual Day function will surely inspire our students to believe that the sky is the limit for those who dare to dream.

We also have with us our Guest of Honour. Prof Rajni Abbi, Proctor, University of Delhi. Prof Abbi is well known for her academic and social contributions. Prof Abbi holds a doctorate degree in Law from the Faculty of Law, University of Delhi. She is a renowned scholar and her areas of specialisation are Commercial Law and Consumer Law. She is Gold Medallist in LLB from Campus Law Centre and Gold Medallist in LLM from Faculty of Law. She has been associated with the Municipal Corporation of Delhi under various capacities. She was Mayor of Delhi from 2011-12. She is also a Visiting Professor at the Beijing Institute of Technology, Beijing, China and a Visiting Professor at Nanjing University of Aeronautics and Astronautics, Nanjing, China.

I would also like to express my gratitude towards the Chairman, Padma Shri S. Vikramjit Singh Sahney, Treasurer, S. Prithpal Singh Sahney and members of the Governing Body for their active support to all our projects.

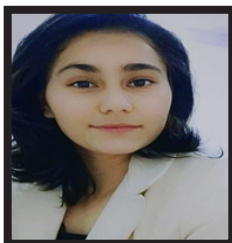

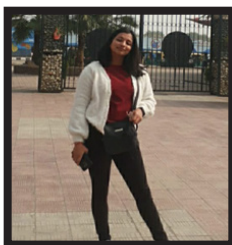

## **ENDEAVOURS TOWARDS INCLUSIVENESS**

### **SCHOLARSHIP AND FEE CONCESSION**

The details of fee concession and scholarships for the academic session 2021 - 2022 are as follows: For the academic year 2021-2022 a total amount of Rs. 14,81,715 (Rupees Fourteen Lakhs Eighty-

One Thousand and Seven Hundred and Fifteen Only) was given as Fee concession to 229 students. This included 71 students from third year, 38 students from the second year and 70 students from the first year. This is an endeavour towards extending support to the weaker section of the society and giving back to the community.

- **Central Sector Scheme for Scholarships for College and University**  
Operational since 2008 the objective of this scheme is to provide financial assistance to the meritorious students having family income of less than Rs. 6 lakh per annum, to meet a part of their day-to-day expenses while pursuing higher studies. 9 Students have been awarded the above scholarship.
- **NSP Post Matric Scholarship for Students with Disabilities**  
The aim of this scholarship is to help students with disabilities to pursue higher studies and to enable them to move towards a dignified life. 12 students from the college have been awarded this scholarship.
- **Post Matric Scholarship Schemes Minorities CS**  
This scheme was started with the purpose of awarding scholarships to meritorious students belonging to economically weaker sections of minority community so as to provide them better opportunities for higher education, increase their rate of attainment in higher education and enhance their employability. 11 students from the college have benefited from this scheme.
- **PG Indira Gandhi Scholarship for Single Girl Child**  
This scheme of scholarship was started to promote girl education at the post-Graduation level. Under this scheme the student should be a single child in the family and has taken admission in regular, full-time 1st-year master's degree program in any designated university or a postgraduate college in the country. For the year 2021-2022, 1 student enrolled in master's program have been awarded the above scholarship.
- **Scholarship Scheme by Delhi Government**  
Merit Scholarship for students belonging to Minority studying in professional/technical colleges/Institutions/Universities. The objective of this scheme is to support the higher education amongst the minority students. The college has verified 26 students to avail the said scholarship.
- **Marga Schulze Merit Scholarship Scheme for Higher Education of Girls with Visual Impairment.**

This scholarship is being provided by Marga Schulze Foundation (Germany) for visually impaired girls to support their higher education. Under the Scheme, merit scholarships are awarded to girl-students pursuing undergraduate, postgraduate and B.Ed. courses respectively. AICB has been implementing the Scheme since 2000-2001. For the year 2021 – 2022, 9 visually impaired students from our college have been awarded this scholarship for the amount ranging from Rs. 5000/- to Rs. 8000/-.

## **INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE**

The Internal Complaints Committee and Internal Quality Assurance Cell collaborated with White Swan Consulting Group to offer a short-term course on Gender Sensitization, D&I, and POSH. The duration of the course was 30 hours, starting from 30 January 2021, to 28 February 2021. The goal

of the seminar was to create gender-sensitive workplaces and to appreciate people of all genders. A total of 170 students from various colleges across the country took part in the course.

On 29 August 2021 an online training programme on the theme “Stand-up against Street Harassment” was organised in partnership with Breakthrough India, ICC. On 29 October 2021, a Self-Defense Training Workshop for students was held. Mr. Shiv Kumar Kohli, a renowned self-defence trainer throughout India and a 2-time Limca Book Record holder and Ms. Kiran Sethi, ASI, Delhi Police, also known as Lady Singham, provided the training to the students and faculty members.

The ICC also organised an Intra-Committee Orientation Program on 22 January 2022, in which all participants gave their viewpoints on the ICC’s functioning, as well as case studies. On 24 January 2022, the ICC organised a session on the topic “Prevention of Online Sexual Harassment” and fundamental rights and duties. The speaker for the session was Sh. Jaideep Tandan. The main objectives behind the session were to educate oneself about sexual harassment, learning about various fundamental duties, rights, and constitutional remedies; and recognize and prevent virtual sexual harassment.

## **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

### **ENACTUS**

The MSC Enactus team is currently focusing on four major projects. The impact created by green projects under Enactus have been instrumental in adding value for our college’s ‘Institutional Values and Best Practices’.

### **PROJECT SILSILA:**

The team which recycles Rumala Sahibs into pouches, collaborated with NGO Shanti Sahyog in February 2022 for stitching of products. They visited Bangla Sahib Gurudwara in February 2022 and secured an order of 70 Gutka sahib covers. Two pouches and first order of 50 Gutka covers were sold with a profit margin of 50%. Silsila also organised an inter-college competition, “What do you meme”? from 25- 31 January, in which participants had to make a meme using Silsila products. Project Silsila participated in the National Competition organised by Enactus India from 14 August to 21 August 2021.

### **PROJECT ECOF**

Initiated in 2021, Project Ecof works with the motive to cut the plastic straw and aid the shift to eco-friendly alternatives. For its pilot initiative, Team Ecof conducted cost-analysis for various

materials, created pamphlets and branded packaging for their straws, and collaborated with Supplier “Social Care” based out of Pune. Many cafes, restaurants, coconut sellers were targeted for the same and 98 free samples of straws have been distributed. In 2022 the idea of edible cutlery was also approved. Samples of bowls and spoons made of maize have been sent for registration with the Food and Drug Association, who have shown enthusiastic support about their feasibility.

## **PROJECTJAMBOARD**

Currently 17 students are being tutored in English by 5 tutors and 6 classes per student have been conducted till date. Phase 1 of class focused on speaking and reading skills has been finished. Project Jamboard organised ‘Spellicans’, A GenZ Spell Bee Competition on 10 March 2022 in Mata Gujri Hall with the aim to improve vocabulary and word skills in students through multimodal ways of teaching using games like Taboo and Jenga. More than 90 students registered themselves for the event.

## **PROJECT ORGANIC MATTERS**

In 2022, members did a study at home and found that 80% of kitchen waste is organic matter. Members made compost at home, and it is now being scaled up.

### **Webinars and Social Media Campaigns:**

Team Enactus organised a webinar on 5 March 2022 to spread awareness on female health issues and fitness with renowned nutritionist Dietician Saloni Arora, with 250 participants. Smoke Chokes Me, A Green Diwali Campaign was carried out on social media to promote Diwali celebration in a sustainable manner, and SEHAT MANN FOR ALL? to promote mental health awareness from 6 October to 10 October 2021. Team Enactus organised a session, the “Brown Bag Connect” on the 6 October 2021 via ZOOM to make students aware of sustainable business environment. Team Enactus took an initiative to provide guidance to the Sikh Minority students regarding admission under Sikh minority quota. A reel was posted on 8 October 2021 on the official website, Instagram page and circulated via Whatsapp which benefited many students.

### **E-WasteDrive:**

E-waste Drive was organised on 28 September 2022 in Mata Sundri College wherein 19kg of electronic waste was collected and donated to NGO Chintan Recycling Center for safe recycling and disposal.

### **Awards and achievements:**

### **TOUR & TRAVEL MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME**

The department achieved 95% placement for our outgoing students. They were placed in renowned organisations like SpiceJet, SOTC, IGT Solutions and Ienergizer.
