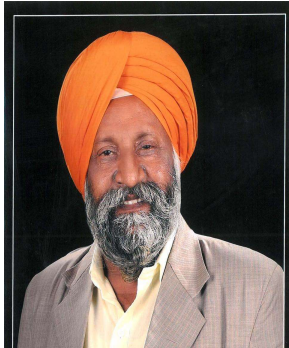

PROGRAMMES FOR ENHANCEMENT OF ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL

The IQAC has been established to develop a system for conscious and consistent improvement in the overall performance of the College. The prime task of this body is to work towards quality enhancement in the institution. This year the IQAC facilitated the completion of the process of accreditation. The College was accredited with a Grade 'A' and a CGPA of 3.18.

The College IQAC initiated participation in other quality audits like NIRF and India Today.

Under the aegis of the IQAC, various departments of the College organised seminars, workshops and lectures. Eminent speakers were invited, and faculty and students participated in large numbers in these activities.

1. Academic Initiatives:

i) The IQAC, in collaboration with Punjabi Sahit Sabha, Delhi and ICSSR organised a three-day International Conference and Paper Presentations on "Rethinking Partition: 75 Years" from 3 to 5 November. Students and faculty presented papers, and renowned speakers were invited to share their views.

These Cells remained active throughout the year and organised talks, lectures and workshops for students.

SCHOLARSHIP AND FEE CONCESSION

The details of fee concession and scholarships for the academic session are as follows:

- Fee Concession

For the academic year 2021- a total amount of Rs. 11,82,866.55 (Rupees Eleven Lakhs Eighty Two Thousand Eight Hundred Sixty Six and Fifty Five Only) was given as Fee concession to 102 students. This included 26 students from third year, 43 students from the second year, and 33 students from the first year.
