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


Image 1: On Going Session in webinar on stock market





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


Image 1: Ongoing Session in Webinar on Data science and analytics





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single aspect of treasury and what path a student can choose as a job option, explaining about front, middle and back office in treasury in corporate and banking sector, roles and responsibilities of cash management, financial management, treasury management & corporate finance. He also briefed students about the stock market by showing the stock's weblogs. The session ended with a showcase of EY initiatives including an introduction to CAFTA and Case Championship 2020. 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


Image 1: Ongoing session in webinar on Treasury & Finance: Busting myths around job roles in financial consulting






Image 2: Ongoing session in webinar on Treasury & Finance: Busting myths around job roles in financial consulting






Image 2: ongoing session in Webinar on PLAGIARISM: CAUSES AND CONSEQUENCES





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6. International Webinar on 'Histories and Heritage: Journey through Archives, Museums and Arts'

Report: International Webinar on Histories and Heritage: Journey through Archives , Museums and Arts

The Department of History of Mata Sundri College for Women conducted a Two Day International Webinar on 'Histories and Heritage - Journey through Archives, Museums and Arts' on 27th and 28th November 2020 under the convenorship of Dr. Daljit Kaur. In the inaugural session on 27th November 2020, Dr. Harpreet Kaur, Principal, Mata Sundri College for Women gave the welcome address highlighting the importance of conserving our heritage and threats and challenges of protecting them for posterity. Dr. Daljit Kaur, Teacher-in-Charge, Department of History presented the concept-note. Keynote address was given by Dr. Meena Gautam, Former Director of National Mission of Monuments and Antiquities. She explained what heritage meant and the different types of heritage. She successfully established the relation of heritage with tourism, culture and history. She briefed about the National Manuscripts Mission . Detailed information through various facts and figures was given about the National Mission on Monuments and Antiquities along with it's legal framework and the milestones achieved.

The First Technical Session on the theme 'Archives and Museums began at 3:15 pm. Dr.Nina Janz, postdoctoral research associate at Luxembourg Centre for Contemporary and Digital History spoke on 'Making of Archives and Research Prospects'. Dr Janz widened the knowledge base by defining cultural heritage as



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done by the EU. The cultural platform Europeana and its purpose was explained. Rules and regulations about the access and use of archival collections were shared for both citizens and foreigners of the EU. She explained the role of an archivist, a researcher and approaches towards a historical document. She wonderfully bridged the gap between an archivist and a historian by painting the former as the builder of a road and the latter as a driver on that road. Dr Janz elaborated about "Arolsen" a special archive on victims and survivors of the Nazi persecution. Not just she displayed the past and present scenario, but she also put forward the future perspectives for archives and research. The first session was concluded by portraying a strong cooperation between cultural heritage and research which can be strengthened by crowdsourcing and open archive projects.

At 4:15 pm the second speaker Dr Forget Chaterera Zambuka spoke on 'Conservation of Museum and Archival Heritage'. She is a postdoctoral fellow at Paris Sorbonne University, Abu Dhabi. She started with specific standards for conservation of museums. A very detailed explanation was given on archival heritage conservation along with mentioning the ancient techniques. Step by step process of conservation was narrated in a student friendly way. She emphasised on the archives and modern archival thinking with its roots in the French Revolution. The concept of preventive conservation for reducing damage and deterioration to museum collections by improving their environment was put forward. Various measures such as controlling temperature, emergency preparedness etc were detailed. Different types of materials and their response to the immediate environment. She brought attention to multiple agents of deterioration to archives



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in the forms of physical biological chemicals and also man made disasters. In her concluding remark by her was more of a sense of responsibility she inculcated within the listeners for being a conservator at all points of life. The technical session was followed by an interactive session where the speakers answered all the queries of participants.

The second session of a two-day International webinar on the topic 'Histories and Heritage - Journey through Archives, Museums and Arts' began at 10:9 am on the theme 'Heritage and Conservation'. The webinar was moderated by Miss Panchali Devi, Assistant Professor Department of History, under the convenorship of Dr Daljit Kaur

The first speaker for this Technical Session was Dr S.P SINGH, former Director, Conservation National Museum and presently chairman, Kasturba Gandhi National Museum and Mahadev Desai Library. This is a mere glimpse into his long and illustrious career. He emphasised on the importance of the people and their persistent contribution working in the field of conservation. He pointed out how heritage is an indispensable part of our lives. He discussed with us in length about the issue of the degradation of the "TAJ MAHAL". He talked about the experiences he had as the head of the Pollution Department and discussed the marble cancer that had happened. He gave us insight about how pollution has affected the most beautiful monument of the world and explained how he worked on the process of mitigating the issue of Taj Mahal through scientific methods and emphasised that the knowledge of science plays an important role in our life, he also pointed out the geographical aspect which has affected the degradation of the



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monument. In speaking about pollution he also discussed the high pollution level of Delhi and how it is impacting the different forts and monuments of Delhi. He spoke about how the monuments are being neglected and not taken care of and the challenges faced by the different institutions. He further elaborated the guideline of the preservation and use of climate control to preserve the manuscripts particularly the "Constitution of India" and many other such important manuscripts. He explained how neglect had caused the destruction, more than any other issue. He elaborated how different programmes should be organised to spread the knowledge and the love for heritage. A detailed presentation was presented on "frescos" conservation of "dakshini deodhi in the entrance of the main shrine of Sri Golden Temple, Amritsar " also pointed out the temperature and wind issues and how it affects the working of the conservator. He highlighted the importance of teamwork and ethics of conservation and how it plays the most important role in the life of a conservator and focused on preventive conservation. The methods of different degradation were explained and the challenges faced by the conservators in India in our country the love can be moulded only by our original heritage and the legacy of preservation should be passed on. He gave detailed insights about the world of conservation and encouraged to take action towards it.



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*The presentation of the second speaker commenced at 11:50. The second speaker of the day Dr V. KALYANI Assistant Registrar, National Museum Institute New Delhi. She spoke about how museums and heritage are two parts of the same coin and are interlinked with each other. The definition of a museum is well presented before us through her detailed presentation and how it became an institution reserved only for the elite class to the institution for all in common. She emphasised the role played by the museums in imparting knowledge and how one learns so many things in a non-formal way. Different terms related to museums were explained, the importance of documentation of the object was pointed out, she spoke about the role of renaissance followed by the period of enlightenment which brought a difference in the field of knowledge and research and led to the coming up and the development of museums, categorisation of museums was highlighted. She discussed how Natural History dominated the collection of the museums and later on the archaeological history. She laid focus on how the activity of museum visiting should be given importance in our country. She elaborated on how the display in the museums evolved from the "cabinet of curiosity" (random display) to categorical display. In a very easy way, the evolution of museums in different continents was presented along with the museum movements in different continents with special reference to the throwing movement in India. She gave insights about the establishment of different museums in India. The building of museums around the archaeological site makes more sense than carrying the object to another place and placing it was pointed out the coming up of the national



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museum of India was focused upon and how the study of museums gained importance in different colleges and universities, and there are virtual museums as well as heritage museums She discussed the need for institutions that will complement schools and colleges for the education on heritage and its conservation.

Museums are of the people by the people and for the people and we all should value them. The question answer session was conducted by miss aarushi mehra, and the webinar was concluded at the valedictory session with report presentation and vote of thanks.

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

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7. Two Days Workshop on Dynamic Economic Issues: Special Focus on India's Middle Class

Report: Two Days Workshop on Dynamic Economic Issues: Special Focus on India's Middle Class

A two day workshop was organized by Department of Economics, Mata Sundri College for Women, University of Delhi in association with B.A. (Programme) Society and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in Collaboration with Meghnad Desai Academy of Economics on 6-7 November 2020. The purpose of the workshop was to enlighten the students regarding the basic foundation, situation and critical issues of the middle class society of India. It made them learn and identify the structure, terminology and potential areas of research in this broad spectrum of arena. The keynote speaker of the workshop was Dr. Sandhya Krishnan, PhD from University of Amsterdam. At the inaugural ceremony, Teacher-In-Charge Mrs. Upasana Dhawan delivered the welcome speech, Principal Madam Prof.(Dr.) Harpreet Kaur and Dr. Lokesh Kumar Gupta enlightened us with their kind and words. First day, the session was moderated by Dr. Jasleen Kaur. Dr. Krishnan explained the origin of the word middle class from the historical perspective which was quotidian in the British Era. She covered the two questions such as how has the middle class in India expanded in the period from 1999-00 to 2011-12 and how sensitive are the results to different definitions of the middle




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class on 6th November. Her accountability and presentation with the tables and graphs catered the interest of the students. She also explained the economic aspect of the middle class in the current scenario. Second day, the session was hosted by Dr. Niti Arora who also pointed out the significance of the workshop. Dr. Krishnan answered the last two questions that how the middle class is different from the poor and affluent in terms of its spending pattern and what is its structural composition. She also showed different videos related to the concerned subject to clarify the concept. The analysis of distribution of the middle class among different sections like caste, class and religion gave an insight for the deep edge of vindication as it's based on the NSSO 68th survey. In the workshop, approximately 80 students have participated and identified the key contextual factors to be taken into account and an assignment is given to all of them as a mandatory requisite to receive the certificate. Many students asked different questions related to this topic and a healthy conversation was established. Lastly, vote of thanks was given by Mrs. Shivani Verma and Principal Prof.(Dr.) Harpreet Kaur and Dr. Lokesh Kumar Gupta. The pro-student approach of the speaker gave new perception and attitude towards the gravity of the topic and as well as provided a plot for the potential research base. It was an informative and illuminating session which renaissance the interest of the students as well as of the faculty members.

The workshop was followed by competition with exciting prizes sponsored by Bunk Pages for the winners. Participants were asked to submit their artwork with Team



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

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


Image 1: Ongoing session in Workshop Hunar'2020: The Artistry Endeavour



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


Image 2: Ongoing session in Workshop Hunar'2020: The Artistry Endeavour

An Initiative of Mata Sundri College for Women in collaboration with Sharevidya Stock market is an important part of the economy of a country. Stock markets also help in promoting investment. To help the students gain an in-depth knowledge about financial marketing our college's Placement and Internship Cell collaborated with Sharevidya to conduct a webinar on 'Financial Market'. Sharevidya is an initiative to encourage folks to do profitable trades in stocks and make maximum out of market volatility. Their motto is to 'Unleash the Power of Financial Wisdom'. The 1st day of the webinar commenced on 19th September, 2020 at 12:00 PM and concluded at 02:00 PM, and a total of 69 students attended the webinar.

Mr. Sidharth commenced the webinar by making the participants perform an activity which helped the students learn about the environment of stock markets. He gave a presentation on basics of stock market, history of stock market in India, timings of stock markets and much more. He explained in-detail about the definition of stock market, the market participants. He briefed the participants about the modes of trading which include equity, future and options, commodity and currency. Mr. Sidharth also explained about important marketing terminologies such as target, stop loss, sensex, broker etc. He helped the students by busting many myths related to stock markets and also informed about the benefits of choosing stock marketing as a profession.

The presentation was then headed by Mr. Amit Jain who is the CEO of Sharevidya. He then explained more about the different concepts of stock markets. He gave many



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
tips on how to manage money in real life, rules for investing and much more. He also made the students understand that why do some people fail while investing. Some factors that he pointed out were greediness, high expectations, running after free advice, etc. He pondered upon topics such as different types of traders, penny stock etc. Mr. Amit Jain also shared his first stock market experience with the students so that they could learn from his mistakes.

The team at Sharevidya provided students with many real life examples for making them understand the concepts of the stock market. 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


Image 1: Ongoing session in Webinar on FINANCIAL MARKET



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


Image 2: Ongoing session in Webinar on FINANCIAL MARKET

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


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awakened the students about how the real world works. The experience of the webinar was wonderful and the attendees appreciated the effort of the organising team to conduct a webinar on such a relevant topic.

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


Image 2: Ongoing session in Data Science Webinar



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


Image 3: Ongoing session in Data Science Webinar



This course on Exploratory Data Analysis using Statistical Software R and SPSS aims to introduce the participants with different aspects of exploratory analysis techniques essential for getting an insight of the data and subsequently implementing an appropriate statistical analysis. It will provide a platform to the participants to deal with various types of data, getting meaningful insights, data visualization, extracting important features and perform the analysis using software R and SPSS. This course will cover different statistical methods and graphics systems essential for exploratory analysis including descriptive statistics, probability distributions, hypothesis testing, statistical modeling, and multivariate techniques to visualize high-dimensional data etc.




Image 1: Ongoing Session in Faculty Development Programme on Exploratory Data Analysis using Statistical Software R and SPSS



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14.Short Term Course on "Entrepreneurial Idea Development and Skill Enhancement"

Report: Short Term Course on Entrepreneurial Idea Development and Skill Enhancement

MSC unveiled UDDHAM, The Entrepreneurship Cell of Mata Sundri College for Women on 5th Feb2021. The Entrepreneurship Cell came up with a Short Term Course on "Entrepreneurial Idea Development and Skill Enhancement" in collaboration with UGC Community College, Kirori Mal College.

Inaugural of this STC could not be any better without the presence of Mr. Ravindra Nath, Ex Chairman and Managing Director, National Small industries corporation (NSIC) as our chief guest. He stated the importance of skills because that is what matters the most. He gave a few interesting examples to highlight the importance of guidance and motivation to people who are talented but just lack vision.

Few astonishing life lessons taught by him sticked to the following:

- 1. One who wants to achieve something should surpass everyone by taking the first step ahead.
- 2. The wonders made by small things are always remarkable and make a lot of difference.
- 3. No one can beat an empathetic person who always puts themselves in other's shoes and brings happiness in others' lives which ultimately bring joy to them.

Session 2 of day 1 was chaired by Mr. Pushpendra Kumar, Associate professor, Kirorimal College, DU. Sir laid down the foundation of this course by giving practical insights into the concept. He shared very relevant examples from day to day life.



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Speaker for the second day session 1 was Mr. Shakeel Ahmad Khan, faculty of Entrepreneurship Development Program at National Small Industrial Corporation, MSME, Government of India. He spilled the stats that how more than 50% Start up companies failed in their initial years due to poor planning and market analysis. He discussed various schemes offered by the MSME to promote startups in India. The audiences' morale was boosted up by outshining various examples of leading startups like Uber, Britannia, OYO, Medicine companies, Maruti, Aashirvaad and many more who supported the fact that new set up businesses should be kicked off with trading rather than manufacturing.

Session 2 Day 2 was taken up by Mr. HP Singh, Chief Consultant in National Institute for Entrepreneurship & Small Business Development, Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Govt. of India. He had a very innovative and creative way of elucidating the concepts of invention, innovation and skill, through story lines, case studies and PowerPoint presentations. He gave instances of many high flyers entrepreneurs and their inspiring success stories.

The event headed up to the third day where we had Professor Vinod Kumar as our resource person. He is a former General Manager in Marketing at Bharat Electronics Ltd. (BEL), and a visiting professor at JIMS and NMIMS. His discussion with the participants forced them to think out of the box. He discussed the startups initiated in 2019 who grabbed the opportunities and bought unique solutions to general problems just like Paytm. He enlightened that every time entrepreneurs should assess everything at the moment, they step outside including problems faced by people, how it can be solved, how can people do it better and also competitive analysis of the market should never be neglected.

The session 2 of day 3 was taken up by Ms. Uzma Mumtaz who is an entrepreneurship mentor in the Incubation Department at National Small Scale



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Industries Corporation. She started with the entrepreneurial support system and its ecosystem. She made participant's mindset clear to never search customers for your product rather always search for a product for your customers. The product should be decided earliest and then market segmentation is to be done for the customers according to their needs and packaging is based on the classes of customers.

We had Dr. Suman Dhawan, Deputy Director (Academic/WCSC), Department of Technical Education and Training, Government of NCT of Delhi. On Day 4 session 1. Dr. Suman voiced her thoughts on what all hindrances may come in the way while an individual plans to start his own business inclusive of risk bearing, peer pressure, ground working and much more. She focused on the MSME grants that help young and budding entrepreneurs by giving a head start and being their helping hand in financial as well as emotional aspects. While focusing on the ever-changing entrepreneurial ecosystem, Dr. Dhawan highlighted how women have been taking charge and shining bright in this ecosystem by sharing a lot of real -life stories with the audience.

The event was headed for the second session of the day 4 with Ms. Sudipti Dhawan, Director Dynamisers solutions having specialization in Cyber Security and Artificial Intelligence as our speaker. She guided students with the proper ways of validating an idea. She focussed on how one can have a pool of ideas and focus on them by researching, having one to one conversation with the competitors, talking to elders, taking regular feedback etc.

On day 5 session 1, the discussion was on "The main reasons for startups failure in India" by our speaker Ms. Sudipti Dhawan. Our participants were encouraged to take a step ahead towards their goal without fearing failure because winners are those who grip some risk too. She told the success story of Vijay Shekhar sharma, co-



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founder and CEO of Paytm which taught the important fact that one should consider while failing is 'I have not failed, I've just found 10,000 ways that won't work'. The second session was conducted by Dr. V.K. Arora, CEO, Incubation Centre Delhi

The second session was conducted by Dr. V.K. Arora, CEO, Incubation Centre Delhi Govt., IGDTUW, Anveshan Foundation. The topic of his session was "Innovation, Entrepreneurship and Business Idea Generation" where he discussed real life examples to explain the terms like innovation and creativity. He laid down the fundamental principle of entrepreneurship that an idea without a solution to the problems is not an entrepreneurial idea. He also talked about "Business Incubators' where he explained how to connect the idea with business incubators and also created awareness among students regarding the number of incubators in Delhi and the way of reaching them.

On Day 6 session 1, we had amongst us Ms. Mamta Prajapati, Sector Expert Food at National Consumer Helpline (Project of Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution). Her session was focussed on the food industry. She apprised participants about the various food businesses that can be undertaken under different domains like packaging, ecommerce, catering etc. Audience was familiarized with the whole process of Registration and Licensing step by step along with that they were told who all needed to register and grab a licence. She stated the key features of the platform FoSCoS and what all things a person requires to login, register for different domains.

Second session of day 6 was taken up by Mr. Nipun Jain, Founder and Business Head, Natty Ninos. A Short term Course on entrepreneurship can't be complete without an entrepreneur himself being a part of it. He narrated his own story starting with how he got the business idea from his experiences, hurdles and ups and downs in the journey and how he overcame those things by recommending to focus on what you want to do, trust yourself, take time to think upon and go with the process. He



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encouraged the participants by asking them to explore and not to restrict themselves within the 4 walls.

Day 7 session 1 was taken up by Mr. Ravindra Nath, Ex Chairman and Managing Director, National Small industries corporation (NSIC). Some life changing short movies were recommended to the participants which can open up their mind sets in various aspects. He focussed mainly on gaining practical skills rather than theoretical learning. He also apprised the participants with many schemes like 'Aspire', 'Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Yojna' and WEP i.e Women Entrepreneurs' Platform which is established specially for women. Second speaker of the day 7 was Mr. Pushpendra Kumar, Associate professor, Kirorimal College, DU. He enunciated about the skills that need to be inculcated in every student so that they can chase their path towards a job provider. He stimulated participants with his known mate's success story which left an inspirational mark in their minds. He unfolded the success stories of Ebay, Coca Cola, Pepsi and many more leading companies who are now touching the heights of success in their own fields.

Also, we conducted one activity on Presenting a Business Plan on Day 7, where Participants formed groups and presented their business ideas. 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who addressed queries of participants related to entrepreneurship. The way he took all the doubts was remarkable.






Image 1: Inaugural Session in Faculty Development Programme On ICT Based New Paradigms Of E-Teaching And E-Learning : Digital Pedagogy






Image 2: Ongoing session in Faculty Development Programme On ICT Based New Paradigms Of E-Teaching And E-Learning: Digital Pedagogy



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16. Faculty Development Program Teacher, Teaching and Teacher Education: Processes, Concerns and Prospects

Report: Faculty Development Program Teacher, Teaching and Teacher Education: Processes, Concerns and Prospects

The six days online Faculty Development Programme (FDP) from 18-23 October, 2020 organised by Department of Elementary Education and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Mata Sundri College for Women, University of Delhi and Teaching Learning Centre for Social Science, Dr. Harsingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya, Sagar (DHGVV, Sagar), Madhya Pradesh (under the aegis of Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching, Ministry of Education), marked another attempt to build an academic discourse around the New Education Policy, 2020. The FDP had its thematic focus on teachers, teaching and teacher education as envisaged in the policy perspective. The support of its patrons Prof. Harpreet Kaur, Principal, Mata Sundri College and Prof. Janak Dulari Ahi, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Dr. Harisingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya, Madhya Pradesh and, and the concerted efforts by Dr. Ravneet Kaur, (Coordinator, FDP, Mata Sundri College), Dr. Lokesh (Coordinator, IQAC, Mata Sundri College) Dr. Sanjay (Convener, FDP, DHGVV, Sagar) and Dr. Afreen (Coordinator, FDP, DHGVV, Sagar) ensured the successful completion of the FDP.

On exploring the NEP 2020 document in context of the given theme, it was



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realised that the policy as it reads, commits itself to structural, pedagogical, curricular and infrastructural changes at various levels of education. In laying out specific measures through which these changes will be accomplished, the policy document envisions the role of the teachers in this process as crucial. However, while the role of the teachers as agents of transformation has been long recognised, gaps continue to exist in ensuring quality preparation, employment and service conditions of these agents of change. There is a dire need of enforcing the standards for quality in each of these aspects so as to empower teachers. The NEP, 2020 recognises this and proposes changes in teacher preparation, recruitment process and service conditions. Among the many proposals, introduction of a 4-year integrated B. Ed. Degree offering a dual specialization in both Education and a second discipline has been a major step towards revamping teacher education in the country. But like for other changes, this too creates opportunities and brings new challenges within itself. Therefore the need to analyse and assess the policy's vision for the teacher and teacher education, thus becomes pressing. It is in the view of these concerns and convictions that the present FDP was planned on the given theme which was further explored with more than 20 sessions where resource persons with expertise in their fields interacted with the participants. These experts were prominent personalities from some of the most prominent institutions of the country like National Sanskrit Foundation, Department of Education, Delhi University, Mahatma Gandhi Antarrashriya Vishwavidyalaya, Wardha, Maulana Azad National Urdu University Hyderabad, GND University, Amritsar, Ambedkar University Delhi, Banaras Hindu University, IGNOU, NCTE to name a few and many others from premier national and international institutes and organizations.



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The FDP saw mass response with more than 250 registrations. It's a matter of pride that the organisers were not only able to reach out to participants across the expanse of the country; the urban, semi -urban and rural belts, but also from our neighbouring country Nepal. The FDP joined by participants affiliated to many central universities, state universities. Private universities and institutions, from located across different states and union territories. The participants represent a diverse cohort of disciplines and research interests. This is very significant in terms of taking the discourse and deliberations that emerged in this FDP further and will contribute to larger discourses both at national and international level that are happening in the area of teacher education.

The various sub-themes through which the programme unfolded concerned a number of dimensions of teacher and teacher education. These encompassed understanding the ways in which the role of the teacher and the expectations from him/ her have been envisaged through ancient philosophies and in the contemporary policy documents, exploring the changes in the curriculum and pedagogy of teacher education programmes to incorporate the understanding of sustainable development goals, deliberating on the major challenges in the implementation suggested for teacher education, and reflecting on the re-envisioned structure of schooling as recommended by the National Education Policy 2020. There was an attempt to weave an interdisciplinary understanding, through perspectives building on different strands of teacher education, whether they emerge from the disciplines of Education or Liberal subjects.

Each day of the programme brought with itself insights about different dimensions. The resource persons engaged the participants in reflection and critical appraisal of



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
a number of aspects of pedagogy, classroom environment, inclusion and many more. Aspects like flipped learning in classrooms, implications and challenges of digital education, changing contours of classroom space and time, issues of self and identity of a teacher, implications for the process of education, notions of learning and disabilities, cultural and civilizational understanding of teacher and learner, child-centred pedagogy, autonomy and agency of teacher and their professional development, processes, methods and means of assessment and evaluation and many more were dealt with. The list is not exhaustive.

Other than providing questions for reflections, the six days of the online FDP was a platform to analyse the strengths and limitations in the NEP 2020. This exercise of detailed discussions is a crucial step forward to identify the incongruities and challenges, and explore further the possibilities and suggestions for a successful ground realisation of the policy in its true sense. Open discussions towards the end of each session, provided opportunities to the participants to raise questions, concerns and express their views. This proved crucial for the sharing of ideas and suggestions, and building dialogue between the speaker and the participants. Involvement of the participants was secured by giving some an opportunity to moderate the sessions and contribute in the conduction of the FDP. The comments. questions and feedback on the FDP is a valuable source of public knowledge and also provides immense scope for improvement. Apart from the apparent learning in terms of session-discussions and participation, for its organisers, this was a great exercise in team building, cooperation, critical and creative thinking, decision making and crisis management. At every step from its conceptualization, to planning and execution there was something new to enhance one's life skills. It is this kind of experience that proves to be a milestone in the process of lifelong learning.

The Commerce Department, Mata Sundri College for Women gave a golden opportunity to its students to learn something out of the box by introducing Short term Skill Development Course on 'Mastering Microsoft 365 Suite' for a 30 hours course from 23rd January 2021 to 3rd February 2021. The Department introduced this course with the aim of preparing its students for future careers. The course commenced with the College spiritual song on 23rd Jan, 2021 attended by Principal, Dr.Harpreet Kaur, Ms.Jaspal Kaur Sahni, Teacher in Charge, Department of Commerce, Dr.S.Kalpana Devi, Course Coordinator, faculties, 85 students and the mentor Mr. Parth Shukla. Dr. Tanu Dhingra along with Anshita Kochar (President of Invictus) commenced the session by giving a warm welcome to the Principal, faculties, students and the Instructor. Then, the Principal gave the welcome speech and guided the students about the importance of this course and how these 30 hours



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will help them in standing out of the crowd, to build their CV and to highlight themselves while appearing for placement. After this Dr.S.Kalpana Devi, the Course Coordinator took over the session and gave her regards to Madam and a brief introduction of Mr. Parth Shukla, the mentor for this course.

Mr Parth Shukla, thanked the Principal, for giving the opportunity and gave a brief introduction about Microsoft 365 GSuite to the students. He made students realize how the corporate world revolves around Microsoft, the difference between older versions and new versions of Microsoft, various subscriptions of Microsoft suite etc. Students were informed to have accounts on outlook/Hotmail, Microsoft teams and EGuru to make their learning simpler. He made the session very interactive by constantly asking questions to students and clarifying their doubts which created a positive vibe and they were looking forward to learning many new things in the upcoming sessions. Students took this opportunity to give a good start to 2021. He started the class with the introduction of Ribbon and customization of Ribbon tool in MS Word along with Properties of the document and Protect Document tool, document password protected, convert the document to only readable, restrict



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editing, digital signature and control the access and Inspect Document tool. Here students learned about inspecting documents properties and making documents available for disabled people and also Manage Versions. Under this he taught to recover unsaved changes done on the document over a period of time and Proofing tool, change the font of the text, edit paragraph, margin and ruler. Apart from this, introduction to apply bookmark, watermark and the customization of watermark was explained with examples.

Session 3 was very insightful as Mr. Parth started this session by solving many assignments, instead of directly jumping to the Microsoft tools which can be used by students for certifications as well.. Each task was unique and for solving them various tools like header, Closed Chevron Process diagram, Insert caption, converting text into table format, table design, copyright, SmartArt, changing theme of the document, sort, and insert footnote was used. He asked students to perform certain tasks by giving assignments and sharing the screenshots or pictures of their solutions and students actively participated in the class. In session 4, doubts raised by students on the previous day's assignments were cleared and also helped them to



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login on 9ledge.pro website for making use of the recordings of each class. Very patiently he solved doubts of each and every student. He took the session ahead by introducing new tools like import text, difference between copy-paste text and imported text, insert multilevel list, convex bevel picture effect, remove blank page and many more. On 27th Jan, it was planned for PowerPoint but the session was started with solving a few queries on MS Word. He discussed how to remove the background from a table (a row or a cell), adding alternate text to a table and writing table description using the table properties option present inside layout. Also table description or alt text which will be useful for people with vision impairment or cognitive disabilities to view what the table is about was explained. Besides this, inserting shapes and write text on it, inserting the contents of a document to another document, inserting hyperlinks in footer or anywhere in the document, inserting a banded quote and many more was explained along with inspecting document and remove any header, footer or watermark. Then he wrapped up with Word and started the introduction of PowerPoint. He discussed how to format the title, deleting a row, inserting a chevron list, etc. A new thing which students learned was to change the chart type using the chart design option. Then he winded up the session by teaching



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about custom Slide Show wherein students can present a slideshow with only the number of slides that they wish to present. The session was quite interactive and informative and Sir taught every functionality extremely well.

The session on the sixth day was continued by Microsoft PowerPoint. Mr. Parth explained the importance of PowerPoint and how students can use it in their day to day life. He taught how to edit videos using PowerPoint using playback steps, convert presentation into printable form, use animation tools for recording and use screen clip tool to take screenshots. He performed all the functions himself with examples to make students understand better. He also told how to put YouTube videos into PowerPoint slides. Then the role of theme and giving hyperlink in the slides was also explained which students felt comfortable to do by themselves. This session was extremely beneficial as they use PowerPoint to give presentations in college, now they can use it more efficiently. On 29th Jan, the session was started by solving a few doubts which students had regarding the assignments given for practice, then some of the new tools from PowerPoint were introduced. First tool taught was merging slides then he taught Mockup, in this the different ways of creating 3D shapes using 2D shapes. Then animation effects, customizing animation



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effects using custom path, sound to the animation, duration to animation, animation to master slide and a lot more about animation was explained and students too working simultaneously on them when he was teaching. In brief, the ways of creating games and making interesting presentations for children using PowerPoint was discussed. Day by day sessions became more interesting as students learnt to use Microsoft 365 in their daily life. The next session started with a small interaction between students and Kalpana ma'am. After this the students were given an idea about saving the assignment folder on drive and sharing it. Next, students were introduced with Excel. First he taught about the basics of excel like cells, rows and columns. He showed various Excel templates (Gantt project chart, timesheet, appointment calendar) and explained the usage of them. Next, the backbone of excel i.e. Data tool, analyzing the data by using it was explained to them. Elaborately he explained about the Pivot table and Pivot chart. In the Pivot chart he taught about slicers, drilling on, drilling up, drilling out and a lot more. Next the use of formatting, alignment, numbers and conditional formatting tools, giving the same color theme to all the workbooks was done with examples, which helped them to understand more on the topic. He then explained the NOW function for giving the current date and



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time and asked to learn 'What if analysis' task as homework.

Today's session, on 31st Jan was extremely interesting as students unfolded a lot of new topics in Excel. These were very fascinating, yet mind boggling. Mr. Parth started off the session by discussing What if analysis. This option is present in the data tab. What if analysis includes: Scenario Manager, Goal seek and Data table. Goal seek is the process of finding the correct input value when only the output is known. Scenario Manager in Excel allows us to change or substitute input values for multiple cells. They learnt number settings wherein it helps to change the currency value, change decimal places etc. The most important feature next he taught was CELL FIXING. This feature allows to reduce work burden and duplicate answers by using the formula only once and the way of copying data from one worksheet to another was also shown to students. There is also a functionality wherein one can name an entire range using the option Name Manager. Some formulas discussed in the class were: MAXIMUM, MINIMUM, AVERAGE, COUNTIF, AVERAGEIF etc. One can also write the family name, mid name or first name of the person using a functionality named Left, Right, Mid under Text



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Functions. Some important functionalities discussed were: Len (Length of characters), Joint strings, Find, Substitute and Concatenate. It's day 10, started by introducing new functions and tools of Excel like IF, AND, NOT, AVERAGE, AVERAGEIF, AVERAGEIFS, VLOOKUP and HLOOKUP. All the functions were done with multiple examples in detail. The theory and practicality for these functions along with the situations where it can be used and also when it should be avoided with these functions was discussed well. Apart from this, the conditions for using these functions and the important points to be kept in mind while using and then he taught various tools like grid lines, print area, print active sheet, print entire workbook and print selection by giving the difference between border tool and grid lines. In the print tool the various options were explained briefly like how to print a selective part of the workbook instead of printing the whole workbook. Highlighting the cells using different options was also done.

Mr. Parth started the session on 2nd Feb by explaining furthermore new functions in Excel like LEFT LOOKUP, CLOSET MATCH LOOKUP, TWO COLUMN LOOKUP, MATCH, INDEX,



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MATCH INDEX, PRICE RETURN and many more was introduced. For some of them it was first time to learn Excel in so deep as most of the functions and formulas were new, so Sir solved many illustrations on each and every function and formula. He made students comfortable and gave an idea about the ctrl page up/ctrl page down option which helps to switch between worksheets easily. In totality it was extremely informative and well understood by students. Today was the last day of the 30 hours Mastering Microsoft Office 365 course. It was all about the office 365 applications except for Excel, Word and PowerPoint which have been discussed in the earlier classes. Here the session was started by discussing about the whiteboard application. This application helps multiple people to sit on a single platform and discuss their opinions regarding a particular topic. Next it went on to the use of One Note application which creates notebooks with multiple sections and multiple pages. It's a combination of the functionalities both Excel and Word. Then Microsoft calendar which basically can be used to create events and set reminders for the same was introduced which helps in analyzing how productive each week has been for an individual. Sway app was also discussed. It is similar to creating a website and is viewed as a newsletter or PPT. It can also be shared to several



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people. The offline Outlook version helps one to review their mails even when they're offline. Also a planner app which helps to allocate work and the way in which they can view the progress was explained well to the students. Then the use of One drive to create and save folders, files and share the One drive link to other people as well was explained and the students were asked to send the given assignments using it. All the sessions went on very well with the topics explained deeply and the students understood and practiced the given assignments regularly. Students made very good interactive sessions on all days and made the speaker explain more on each and every topic with more examples which enabled them to become well versed in the subject. The Short term Skill development Course conducted by the college will be very much useful to students as they learnt the use of Microsoft 365 GSuite in depth and the aspects of using it in their career perspective.

Report: Short Term Skill Development Certificate Course on Python for Machine Learning and Data Science

Department of Mathematics and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Mata Sundri College for Women in collaboration with 9LedgePro-Microsoft Partner Network organized a Short Term Skill Development Certificate Course on "Python for Machine Learning and Data Science". The course commenced on 31st October 2020 with an inaugural ceremony which began with a melodious rendition of the college prayer. The Course Coordinator, Ms. Sonia Aneja welcomed the Principal Prof. Harpreet Kaur, the Course Speaker Mr. Parth Shukla, Co-founder, 9LedgePro-Microsoft Partner Network and the Teacher-In-Charge (TIC) of Department of Mathematics Ms. Mandeep Walia. The Principal then addressed the participants and motivated them with encouraging words. TIC also wished the students all the best for the successful completion of the course. 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

Students created python scripts and worked on the data-sets to apply ML. The Instructor interacted with the students on a one-to-one basis and took their doubts in each session. 6 assessments and a final test were taken during the course to strengthen their knowledge of the Python language.

The live sessions concluded on 22nd November 2020 with a closing ceremony where the TIC, Ms. Mandeep Walia and the Course Coordinator Ms. Sonia Aneja proposed a vote of thanks and some of the participants shared their experiences and feedback of the course. In this world where competition increases routinely, students are often torn between learning and applying concepts in the real world. A significant gap has been observed in the theoretical knowledge provided to students in our education system and the practical application of those concepts on an industrial level. There is a visible gap in what is taught and what is required as skills to be able to practice it for increased productivity.

To bridge this gap between academia and industry, the Placement and Internship Cell of the college along with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) brought on an interactive Awareness session for its students on **8**th **February**, **2021**. 




Image 1: Ongoing session in An Interactive Awareness Session on Bridging the Gap between Academia and Industry






Image 2: Ongoing session in An Interactive Awareness Session on Bridging the Gap between Academia and Industry






Image 3: Ongoing session in An Interactive Awareness Session on Bridging the Gap between Academia and Industry

Report: An Interdisciplinary National Conference on The Topic: Professional Ethics: Theory And Practice

DEPARTMENT OF PHILOSOPHY (ASTITVA), MATA SUNDRI COLLEGE FOR WOMEN, ORGANISED AN INTERDISCIPLINARY NATIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE TOPIC: PROFESSIONAL ETHICS: THEORY AND PRACTICE, ON 21ST AND 22ND JANUARY 2020. IT WAS SPONSORED BY INDIAN COUNCIL OF PHILOSOPHICAL RESEARCH, MHRD, NEW DELHI. THE CONFERENCE HAD IN ATTENDANCE, MANY EMINENT SPEAKERS. THE INVITED SPEAKERS GAVE TALKS ON MANY IMPORTANT TOPICS INCLUDING BUT NOT RESTRICTED TO: MEDICAL ETHICS, SPORTS ETHICS, MILITARY ETHICS ETC.

The conference began with the singing of the melodious college prayer. The invited speakers along with the principal of the college, then took part in the auspicious lighting of the lamp to invoke the blessings of almighty.

First event of the two-day conference was the Inaugural Session. It took place in the college auditorium. Felicitation of guests took place in typical MSCW flair with the respected Principal of the college **Prof. (Dr.) Harpreet Kaur Jaswal** extending a warm welcome to the Chief Guest of the program **Prof. (Dr.) Bhushan**



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Patwardhan (Vice-chairman, UGC, New Delhi), keynote speaker Prof. (Dr.) R.C. Sinha (Chairman, ICPR, New Delhi), guest of honour Mr. Joseph Kabakeza (Deputy High Commissioner, Rwanda), distinguished guest Prof. (Dr.) Balaganapathi Devarakonda (HoD, Department of Philosophy, Delhi University) and Prof. (Dr.) Mrs. Vibha Chaturvedi (former Head of Department, Department of Philosophy, Delhi University) by presenting them with plants and mementoes. The Convener of the Conference Dr. Lakshmi Vats (Teacher-in- charge, Department of Philosophy, Mata Sundri College for Women) welcomed the Principal and distinguished guest Sardar Harindar Pal Singh (member, College Governing Body) by felicitating them with the same.

This was followed by the release of the souvenir. The guests then came up to present their addresses which focused on congratulating the college and department for organising such a relevant conference. The impact, scope and need for professional ethics in the contemporary world was highlighted by different guests. With the announcement of tea, the session came to close.

The first session of the day was chaired by **Dr. Vibha Chaturvedi** and had as its speakers- **Dr. Balaganapathi Devarakonda Balaganapathi Devarakonda**, and **Dr. Yatish Sharma**. Professor Balaganpathi spoke on the need for making philosophical academia more accessible. And highlighted the different occupations that have arisen due to the intermingling of ethics and other fields. Professor Khanna bases her talk around the importance of Gandhian Philosophy in the



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present times. Dr. Sharma laid emphasis on the tenets that govern medical ethics (autonomy, confidentiality, benefit and justice). The Chairperson, Dr. Chaturvedi stressed the importance of Truth and Integrity as universal ethics which are common to all professions.

The second session started in much the same way with the welcome and felicitation of **Dr. Yatish Sharma**, **Dr. Vaihali Dhingra** and **Dr. M.P. Singh**. Dr. Yatish Sharma Chaired the Session. Dr. Dhingra shared her wisdom and experience on Corporate Ethics as well as on Model Business Principles. She mentioned that it is important to analyze one's means of growth for sustainable development and for maintaining public health standards. Dr. Singh highlighted the need for mutually beneficial practices in business that are ethical in nature. Dr. Sharma in his concluding remarks shared his experience as a medical doctor, who has to practice ethics as a caregiver and a service provider. He then summed up the session by highlighting the key features of the talk.

With this the plenary sessions of day one came to close.

Day two of the conference began with plenary session 3. The guests were felicitated with mementos. This session was Chaired by **Prof. (Dr.) Jata Shankar**. He enlightened on the topic: Classical Indian Perspective. He emphasized on the need for reflecting on past mistakes and bettering ourselves. The first speaker of the session, **Prof. (Dr.) Ritu Gaur.** She talked about the responsibilities of



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academicians towards students, colleagues, parents and community. Her focus then shifted to the rising challenge of plagiarism and how to deal with it.

The second speaker of the session was **Mr. Manish Mudgal**. He discussed core ethical areas in teaching- (a) Knowledge, (b) Integrity, (c) Kindness, (d) Courage, (e) Scientific temper. He elaborated on the difference between information and knowledge as a path to holistic success. The enlightening session came to an end with a vote of thanks.

Session 4 of the conference had professor **S.C. Sharma** as its chair and **Professor Deepak Gaur, Dr Sandeep Tiwari** and **Professor Usha Tandon** as its speakers. Prof Gaur highlighted how ethics is related with moral principles and creates and non- acceptable behaviour. He explained how medical practices have evolved and made ethics an important and essential part of research work; and how ethical negligence can have far reaching consequences. Dr Tiwari spoke on sports ethics. He enumerated the need for clean sports culture. It was further highlighted that sports people need to follow certain rules and practice such standards that do not question the integrity of the sports. Prof Tandon highlighted why legal ethics is important for society and lawyers. Lawyers are responsible for maintaining the honor and dignity of the law profession. Conduct of legal professionals not only affects the individual but also the administration of justice which is the foundation of civilized society. Prof Sharma in his remarks, referenced the Guru Granth Sahib. He highlighted the role of ethics and how individuals in various capacities impact



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this. Teachers must carry his behavior so that the students can learn the code of conduct or people behavior which is based on moral principles. Distinguished guest Sardar Harinder Pal Singh highlighted the importance of values and ethics in the society and why it is important for the youth to understand it.

The Plenary Session 5 of the conference was titled 'Military Ethics' and it started with felicitation of the speakers- Major General (Rtd.) Sanjay Soi and Captain SB Tyagi.

Major General (Rtd.) Sanjay Soi emphasised on the need for military personnel to be guided by ethics. The values of integrity, loyalty and discipline become so deeply imbued that it translates to personal life as well.

Captain (Rtd.) SB Tyagi in his lecture titled 'War, Warfare and Prisoners of War: Role of Ethics' discussed how war is inevitable in human society but they are to be fought with ethics. The main thrust of his lecture was how prisoners of war are to be treated ethically.

During the two days of the conference, parallel sessions were held for paper presenters. Over the period of two days, 27 papers were presented. The presenters were from different educational backgrounds- most were research scholars while some were undergraduate students as well. Through these papers, a variety of topics related to morality and ethics were covered. **Dr. Jasjit Kaur**, Senior Associate Professor, Department of Political Science, MSCW and **Dr. Rekha Navneet**, Associate Professor, Department of Philosophy, University of Delhi



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chaired and co-chaired the session on the first day. On the second day, the paper presentation was chaired by **Dr. Ajay Verma**, Associate Professor, Department of Philosophy, JNU and co-chaired by **Dr. Radhika Menon**, Associate Professor, Department of Education, Mata Sundri College.

The Valedictory Session of the conference was the perfect conclusion to the whole event. The principal of the college, welcomed and felicitated **Air Marshal (Retd.) Jagjeet Singh and Prof. (Dr.) Mrs. Shashi Prabha Kumar.** In his Valedictory Address, Jagjeet Sir, told the audience that he had served in the armed forces for 31 years. He took great pleasure in sharing his biggest life lesson: one should work hard towards their goal; while maintaining their loyalty, discipline and integrity. Dr. Kumar referred to the Indian system of Varna Dharmas to highlight the need for everyone to act according to the way they want to be treated.

Dr. Lakshmi Vatsa, ended the conference on a high note with a vote of thanks that included all and left none.

The national anthem was played, following which the conference came to a close.




Image 1: Panel for Inaugural Session in An Interdisciplinary National Conference on The Topic: Professional Ethics: Theory And Practice




Image 8: Guests of Parallel Sessions being felicitate ding An Interdisciplinary National Conference on The Topic: Professional Ethics: Theory and Practice

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

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


Image 1: National Webinar on Technology-Enabled Higher Education in India: Challenges and Opportunities






Image 2: Ongoing Session in National Webinar on Technology-Enabled Higher Education in India: Challenges and Opportunities



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23.International Webinar: 'Experiences of 'Engaging with Diverse Communities and Key Leanings'

Report: International Webinar: Experiences of 'Engaging with Diverse Communities and Key Leanings

The IQAC, MSC organized an International Webinar on Experiences of 'Engaging with Diverse Communities and Key Leanings'. The Principal **Prof.(Dr.)** Harpreet Kaur welcomed the panellists and shared her observations on the topic after introductory remarks by Coordinator IQAC Dr. Manisha Mathur. The panellists, Ms Surpreet Cheema (Registered Psychologist with Australian & New Zealand Board) and Ms. Vinita Satija (Mental and Public Health Professional, India), two professional with firsthand experience of working with diverse communities at the grass root level, responded to a number of questions and concerns raised by Moderator and Convener, Dr. Garima Kumar, who highlighted the need for engaging with communities as a third important pillar of higher education in the new curriculum framework, apart from teaching and research. Pertinent issues discussed were; how to develop an effective approach to engaging with communities?; what strategies are needed to enhance participation?, how can evaluation mechanisms be made robust? How can community engagement be a mutually beneficial process for all, by collectively incorporating diverse perspectives and stories?, how can we remain sensitive to the needs of diverse stakeholders by not just incorporating privileged positions of a dominant few researchers/ practitioners? how can we infuse the spirit of learning and serving in higher education institutions? and more. Sharing real life examples, their challenges and dilemmas from the field, the panellists enriched over 170 participants across



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different universities of the country with their insightful observations. Some practical steps that emerged from the interaction include:

- Challenging ones assumptions of understanding of what the "other" party looks like or needs. Accepting that there is much we do not know or understand.
- Institutions of higher education, -students, academia, administrators and civil society may begin by simply asking community members about their desires or objectives for a partnership and programme, to make all conversations and programme partnerships mutually meaningful.
- Significance of evaluating community perspectives, putting their voices at the centre of conversations on partnerships and incorporating the findings into the program design and development. Maintaining a posture of humility in all we do.

The session ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Harinder M. Sandhu.

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24. Webinar entitled "Intellectual Property Rights in Traditional Knowledge and Biodiversity"

Report: Webinar entitled Intellectual Property Rights in Traditional Knowledge and Biodiversity

The Department of Philosophy and IQAC of Mata Sundri College for Women organised a webinar on 9th May 2020 entitled "Intellectual Property Rights in Traditional Knowledge and Biodiversity". The webinar commenced at 12.30 p.m. with introductory remark made by Dr Manisha Mathur, member of IQAC, which was followed by the welcome address presented by the honourable principal Dr Harpreet Kaur who introduced the esteemed speaker Professor (Dr) Amar Singh, highlighting his eventful career in the field of education and the topic of discussion for the day. The session was then handed over to the eminent speaker. He began by calling traditional knowledge and biodiversity rich economic resources and delineated on the meaning of traditional knowledge. The speaker then elucidated the denotation of Intellectual Property Rights and its importance in the field of biodiversity, the main



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tools of IPR being patents, copyrights, trademarks and geographical indications. The tools of IPR are designed to safeguard the interests of the preserving indigenous community.

The discussion then directed towards the regime of IPR that is contingent upon the nature of the economy and varies from one to another namely the capitalist system, the socialist system and the mixed economic system. In the regime, the final aim of the capitalist system is the marketing of IPR for profit making, while in a socialist system, the aim concerns the use of IPR for the benefit of the citizens and safeguard the interest of the primary stakeholders concerned.

The speaker then discussed the imminent politics of conflict of interest between the holders of traditional knowledge and the prospectors who are involved in commodifying traditional knowledge for the use of the global market. He also outlined the objectives and purposes of global agreements on IPR such as Convention of Biodiversity (CBD) and Trade related aspects of IPR (TRIPS). He provided the audience with an assessment of protection guaranteed under these two initiatives. He also highlighted the practice of countries of global worth who are holding back several pirated patents of Indian traditional knowledge and enumerated



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some examples like neem oil patent held back by the European patent, turmeric patent held back by the USA patent. The speaker elucidated efforts undertaken by the government of India to document traditional knowledge by creating a Traditional Knowledge Digital Library (TKDL), however, he also highlighted the loopholes of the Indian IPR regime as found in the biodiversity act of 2002 which does not fully safeguard the interests of the indigenous knowledge bearers.

Having emphasised the loopholes, the speaker suggested legal improvements and required administrative action that would ensure the benefit sharing to the indigenous communities. As a conclusion, the speaker aptly noted the moral issues involved in strengthening the IPR regime of India and further the economic benefits that would accrue to the communities as a result of the strengthening of the former.

The session was then followed by the question and answer round moderated by Dr Hemlata Krishnani who prominently took questions of the audience regarding safeguarding the traditional knowledge. The speaker answered the questions while emphasising the idea of the kitchen of the houses being a storehouse of tradition knowledge where one can find a number of ingredients with medicinal benefits.



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The question answer round was followed by the vote of thanks delivered by Dr Lakshmi Vatsa, teacher-in-charge, Department of Philosophy, who wholeheartedly thanked the eminent speaker, Principal madam, organisers and the audience for making the webinar a success. Indeed, it would be justified to say that it was an enriching and enlightening webinar.

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analysis and related fields of Data Science. He had been a lead analyst for the past 4 years and guided the students about the corporate exposure and the basic aspects of Machine Learning.



The speakers interacted with the students on one-to-one basis. Both students and faculty found the session beneficial and interesting as it was conducted in an




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elaborate yet simple manner. Students got E-Certificates at the end of the sessions. The workshop was conducted with an aim to help students improve and enhance their technical skills

The **International Seminar** held on 3rd February focussed on walks as a pedagogic method and explored conservation practices in order to nurture and sustain heritage.

The keynote address was by historian, author and convenor of Delhi IN-TACH, Dr. Swapna Liddle. 

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30.Faculty Development Programme on Emerging Trends in Research Methodology

Report: Faculty Development Programme on Emerging Trends in Research Methodology

An interdisciplinary, weeklong Faculty Development Programme on *Emerging* Trends in Research Methodology was organized by IQAC Mata Sundri College for Women in collaboration with Mahatma Hansraj Faculty Development Centre from 7-12 October 2019. 75 teachers from all over the country participated in the programme. The aim behind the FDP was to highlight how methodologies and paradigms have changed considerably in the last few years across all disciplines. Research has accompanied humankind since its inception. Holding as constant the intent of enquiry, namely the pursuit of truth, the techniques to uncover the same have altered and evolved over time. The process and product of scientific investigation and enquiry have been shaped by multiple factors; technological leaps and various cultural traditions to name a few. Methodologies and paradigms have changed as have ontology and epistemology. The purpose of the FDP was to show the intersectionalities of seemingly diverse academic fields of knowledge as well as varied research methods and techniques. As a corollary, an initiative to pivot a move directed at evolving methodologies for interdisciplinary enquiry has become imperative. During the FDP, both the Qualitative and Quantitative aspects of research were the focus of attention.

The programme began with the Inaugural Session held on 7th October at 9.30 a.m. in Mata Gujri Hall of the college. The session began with the college prayer and was followed by lighting of the lamp by all the dignitaries. Dr. Urmila Devi, Joint



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Secretary UGC was the chief guest and Prof. K.D. Broota, former head, Department of Psychology was the keynote speaker at this session. The speakers spoke about the importance of research and the points to be kept in mind during the process of research. Further, it was highlighted that research should fulfill certain social objectives. Keeping in view the interdisciplinary nature of the programme a session on *Emerging Trends of Research in Social Sciences* was organized where Prof. A.S. Narang, former registrar IGNOU spoke about the emerging areas of research in social sciences like Subaltern Studies and Cultural Studies to name a few. A session on *Interview Techniques* by Prof. Anuradha Bhandari, Punjab University proved to be extremely useful for researchers wishing to collect primary data from the field. The session on *New Ways of Doing History: Oral and Visual Histories since 1945* by Dr. Anirudh Deshpande, Department of History, Delhi University focused on how recent research in the discipline of History had shown the importance of oral and visual narratives which could challenge the traditional ways of studying history.

The first session of the second day, 9-10-2019, of the FDP on *Evidence Based Policy* Making: Methodological Issues by Prof. Amitabh Kundu CSRD, JNU looked at the volatility in India's economic growth and how this could be addressed through focusing on structural factors and continuous adjustment in long term policy making. The next speaker Ms. Aparna Bhatia from the Indian Economic Service looked at research from a different perspective, highlighting how a researcher could use government data for research. The extremely interesting session **Ethnomethodology** by Prof. Shalina Mehta, highlighted how conversations could be used as a research methodology with a special focus on research on tribal communities. The session on Methodological Issues and Trends in the Study of **International Relations** by Dr. Saurabh Mishra, Indian Council of World Affairs



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focused on how various methodologies, Qualitative as well as Quantitative, Discourse Analysis and Grounded Theory could be used while doing research in International Relations.

Keeping in view the interdisciplinary nature of the programme, the first session of 10-10-2019 was devoted to *Emerging Trends in Dalit Discourses*. The speaker, Prof. Ajmer Singh Kajal from CIL, JNU spoke about Dalit discourse and Dalit literature and the need to empower the community struggling against a system that had kept them enslaved for centuries. The next speaker, Prof. Anita Ghai from Ambedkar University spoke of a marginalization of a different kind with her focus on *Qualitative Research in Disability Studies*. Prof. Ghai spoke about "emancipatory" research which empowers those who are being researched upon. Moving away from social sciences and literature, the next session on *Impact of* **Recent Methodologies in Microbiome Research: Vision for future,** introduced the participants to the complex world of microbiomes and the latest research being carried out in the field. The next session on Emerging Trends of Research in Finance, by Prof. Yamini Agarwal, Director, IIF Business School (AKTU), Dean (Research) Indian Institute of Finance focused on recent trends of research in finance which could look at different areas such as Pension Finance, CryptoCurrency, Bilateral and Multilateral Trade to name a few.

Day four, 11-10-2019 began with an extremely interesting session on *Emerging Research Trends in Sanskrit Literature* by Prof Girish Pant, Jamia Milia Islamia University. Prof. Pant spoke about how literature in Sanskrit was not only written in Ancient India, but continues to be produced even in the 21st century. Prof. Chamanlal, the next speaker of the session *Translation*, *History and Literature* highlighted the importance of research being done in the area of Translation Studies



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and underscored the interdependence of literature and history. The session on *Qualitative Research Paradigms* by Prof. Anand Prakash, Dean School of Social Sciences looked at changing paradigms of qualitative research in recent times. In the last session on *Methods of Research in Adivasi Literature*, Dr. Ganga Sahay Meena, CIL JNU expressed his views that while researching Adivasi literature one needed to keep preconceived notions at bay. He then went on to highlight various aspects of tribal literature including the importance of oral narratives.

The last day of the FDP, 12-10-2019, began with a session on Emerging Trends in *Population Studies with Special Reference to Disability and Ageing* by Prof. Bhupinder Zutshi, former registrar, JNU. He began by examining "what is research?", "what is methodology?" and how these can be applied to population studies. The session by Dr. Hemant Dangi, Delhi School of Economics on *Business Research* looked at various dimensions of business research and was extremely interactive. The next speaker of the day Mr. Nitin Raj from KPMG, speaking on *Big Data and Analytics* talked about the relevance of Data Sciences and Analytics in research and how Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning could help in the analysis of Big Data. The FDP came to a close with the Valedictory Session. Mr. Ashok Arora, advocate Supreme Court was the chief guest on the occasion. Prof. Rama, Principal Hansraj College and Chairperson, MHRFDC was also present at the session. Both the speakers spoke about the role of parents and teachers in a world which was becoming fiercely competitive for children. The function came to an end with Prof. Rama and Mr. Arora distributing certificates to the participants.

The IQAC organized a Workshop on the topic — "INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS" (IPR), on 5 March, 2019 at 1.00 PM in Mata Gujri Hall. It was conducted by Dr. VK Ahuja, In- Charge Law Centre II, University of Delhi for the students and faculty of the college. More than 230 faculty members and students participated in the event.

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Copyrights were economic rights that gave an individual the right to reproduce work, issue copies of the work, perform the work in public, make any cinematographic film or sound recording of the work and obtain rental rights incase of computer programs. This was especially relevant to the students enrolled in various academic courses and helped them get an understanding of the dos and do n'ts while writing an academic paper. Concerns of Ethics in Research, citation issues in academic writing and its importance of producing quality research work was highlighted.






