Principal Prof (Dr.)Harpeet Kaur welcomed the guest speakers Dr. Itisha Nagar and Dr. Sanjana Seth. Dr Sanjana, a psychologist and a psychotherapist, specializes in child, adolescents and adult mental issues and life skills training. She introduced the session explaining language sensitivity and also talked about implicit-explicit communication along with examples of her enriched experiences. Dr. Itisha, an academician and a mental health advocate was the next speaker. She highlighted the insensitive and sexist words used for females, based on the work they do, habits they have, personality, dressing style/appearance, etc. She also talked about normalization versus trivialization of mental illness and the importance of personal preferences for being addressed. This was followed by a 25minute panel discussion facilitated by Gursheel and Parneet. There was a discourse about how to apply these learnings to daily life. The psychologists successfully captivated the attention of the audience which led to a chat box filled with questions and appreciation.
